# National Board Certification

#### An Opportunity to be Recognized and Rewarded as a Master Teacher

### Mississippi legislation provides support to teachers seeking advanced certification through the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS).

#### For public school teachers with at least three years of teaching experience, the state will:

- Reimburse the \$2500 fee on <u>completion</u> of the process (*whether or not certification is achieved*).
- Pay National Board Certified Teachers a salary supplement of \$6000 per year for the life of the Certificate (*10 years*).
- Renew MS Teaching License for one five-year period. (See <u>MS Guidelines for Educator Licensure</u>.)
