General Notes Related to Approved Courses

Note 1: All dual credit courses must be specified in an agreement BETWEEN THE HIGH SCHOOL AND THE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION. A suggested template is provided at the end of this section. **School districts must use the dual credit course codes located in this manual so that the Mississippi Department Education (MDE) can track dual credit course enrollment. Each dual credit course listed under the academic education sections will be worth 1 full Carnegie unit.**

Note 2: All course codes in the areas of Dual Credit, Correspondence, Mississippi Virtual Public School (MVPS), and Distance Learning have “NONE” indicated for the endorsement. The “NONE” endorsement indicator means that the school entering the information in the Mississippi Student Information System (MSIS) is not responsible for providing the certified teacher for the course, but rather the certified teacher is provided by another school/district for distance learning, by the MDE for MVPS, and by the postsecondary institution. In some cases, the postsecondary institution may approve a local high school teacher to teach the postsecondary course eligible for dual credit. Note 3: Any local education agency (LEA) that offers credit recovery must develop and implement a credit recovery program that has been adopted by the school board and that includes rules, regulations, and processes. Course code 801000 is available for credit recovery courses. School districts have two options for addressing credit recovery in the MSIS.

- Option A: A student receives a failing grade for a course(s) and will be enrolled in credit recovery.
 - Enter the credit recovery course code 801000.
 - Change the grade in the system after the student completes the credit recovery course.
 - Indicate that change of grade was due to credit recovery.
- Option B: A student receives an Incomplete (I) for a course and will be enrolled in credit recovery.
 - Enter the credit recovery course code 801000.
 - Change the Incomplete (I) in the system after the student completes the credit recovery course.
 - Indicate that the change of (I) was due to credit recovery.

The course code 801000 should be entered one time per school year regardless of the number of credit recovery courses a student is taking.

NOTE: A student who uses credit recovery to earn a Carnegie unit may only earn a minimum passing grade on the district grading scale.

Official Guidance for Dual Credit Process

A **dual enrolled student** is a student who is enrolled in a community or junior college (CJC) or state institution of higher learning (IHL) while enrolled in high school.

A **dual credit student** is a student who is enrolled in a CJC or IHL while enrolled in high school **and** who is receiving high school credit and college credit for *postsecondary coursework*.

Students must meet **all** eligibility requirements below (1-3) as agreed upon by the IHLs:

1. Minimum overall GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale on all high school courses;
2. Successful completion of at least 14 core high school units and/or junior status
OR
30 ACT composite score or equivalent SAT score; and
3. District/school & university student approval agreement (or recommendation).

Notes:

- Placement into college credit courses at IHL universities will be based on appropriate ACT/ SAT (or equivalent) scores.
- 3 to 12 credit hours per term are recommended at IHL universities as long as a B average is earned in first two approved courses. The university and district may waive maximum or minimum credit hours attempted per term based on sufficient student academic information.

Students must meet **all** of the following eligibility criteria in either Option One **or** Option Two as agreed upon by the CJC's to be eligible to take **academic** general education courses as dual credit/dual enrollment:

- **Option One:** Students may be admitted to this dual enrollment/dual credit program with a minimum overall 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale on all high school courses **and** with successful completion of 14 core high school units and/or high school junior status. Each student seeking admission to this program must submit an unconditional written recommendation from his/her high school principal or guidance counselor.
- **Option Two:** Students may also be admitted to the dual enrollment/dual credit program with a minimum of an overall 3.0 GPA on all high school courses **and** a minimum composite ACT score of 30 or the equivalent SAT score. Each student seeking admission to this program must submit an unconditional written recommendation from his/her high school principal or guidance counselor.
- A semester's worth of credit for academic general education courses is defined as 15 credit hours for the CJC's. Developmental education courses **cannot** be taken for dual credit. Local placement scores will be used to determine college-readiness placement.

Students enrolled in eligible CTE courses may have different requirements. For more information, contact the CTE office at (601) 359-3461.

NOTE: The courses eligible for dual credit are determined by the IHLs and CJs in collaboration with the MDE. The “Dual Credit” list includes college course titles. If there are questions about course eligibility, please refer them to the IHL or CJC in which the high school student will be dually enrolled. Only the courses designated as “Dual Credit” will be available for students to earn dual credit. Each 3 hour college course will count for 1 full Carnegie unit. **There is no longer a need to develop course content equivalents between high school courses and college courses.** LEAs shall determine how to apply Carnegie units earned through dual credit courses toward high school graduation requirements based on the content area of the postsecondary course. Carnegie unit credit will be indicated on the high school transcript.

An agreement between LEAs and IHLs/CJCs shall be established prior to the enrollment of students in a dual credit course. The agreement shall detail how issues of tuition and fees, transportation, instructional personnel, materials and sites, academic progress monitoring, and grade documentation will be resolved between the LEAs and the IHLs/CJCs.

Mississippi Department of Education Dual Credit/Dual Enrollment Agreement Guidance

This guidance is provided with reference to sections 37-15-38 and 37-15-39, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, in order to revise and clarify the provisions relating to dual enrolled students and dual credit students.

What is a dual enrolled student?

A dual enrolled student is a student who is enrolled in a community or junior college or state institution of higher learning while enrolled in high school.

What is a dual credit student?

A dual credit student is a student who is enrolled in a community or junior college or state institution of higher learning while enrolled in high school and who is receiving high school and college credit for postsecondary coursework.

Who is eligible for dual credit courses?

Before credits earned by a qualified high school student from a community or junior college or state institution of higher learning may be transferred to the student's home school district, the student must be properly enrolled in a dual enrollment program.

Students must meet the following eligibility criteria:

The Boards of Trustees of the Community and Junior College (CJC) Districts and the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) may recommend to the State Board of Education admission criteria for dual enrollment programs under which high school students may enroll at a community or junior college or university while they are still attending high

school and enrolled in high school courses. Students may be admitted to enroll in community or junior college courses under the dual enrollment programs if they meet that individual institution's stated dual enrollment admission requirements.

The following components must be contained at a minimum in the school district's agreement:

- A ratification of articulation agreements between the CJC/IHL and the school district by the local school board.
- Courses and programs available to students eligible to participate in dual credit, including a plan for the CJC/IHL to provide guidance services in:
 - The process by which parents and students are notified of the option to participate (i.e., inclusion in the student handbook).
 - The process by which students and parents exercise their option to participate. It is important that parents and students understand the concept of academic control and responsibility. The high school is not the responsible party for monitoring of the student's academic performance at the CJC/IHL.
 - High school credits earned for completion of a dual credit course.
 - High school graduation requirements met through completion of dual credit courses.
 - Eligibility criteria for student participation in dual credit courses and programs.
 - Institutional responsibilities for student screening prior to enrollment, and monitoring of enrolled students.
 - Institutional and/or school district responsibilities for the cost of dual credit courses and programs.
 - Responsibility for providing student transportation. It is important to stipulate the responsible party for transporting students to the college campus.
- Mechanisms and strategies for promoting "Career and Technical Education" programs of study.

Dual Credit Courses Offered through MDE

The MDE shall make available a listing of dual credit course titles that will match the course titles available for dual credit at the CJsCs and IHLs in Mississippi. These course titles will correspond to the college level courses offered and taught at the CJsCs/IHLs. The listing will be developed and amended by the CJsCs/IHLs. These courses will be available to be accepted in lieu of courses required for graduation and elective credit, except for the required courses that are part of the Mississippi Assessment Program. Those courses are Biology I, Algebra I, English II, and U.S. History.

Postsecondary level developmental courses may not be considered as meeting the requirements of the dual credit program. A university or community or junior college shall make the final decision on what courses are eligible for semester hour credits. The Carnegie units awarded for the dual credit courses will be indicated in the Approved Courses Manual each year.

High School Carnegie Unit Equivalency

One (1) three-hour university or community or junior college course is equal to one (1) high school Carnegie unit.

Helpful Hints

A strong dual enrollment/credit agreement protects both the students and the institutions, provides win-win solutions to financial challenges, and allows for maximum access. Districts that report the greatest satisfaction with their dual enrollment/credit programs typically have successfully negotiated the following:

- **Tuition Responsibility**

For a pure dual credit course, each entity can contribute toward the cost of the instructor. While all articulation agreements must address this important element, it is important to be flexible and exercise latitude in providing for educational opportunities. In many cases, local school districts and college partners may negotiate to waive the cost of classes or students could be required to pay tuition cost sufficient to cover the costs of a teacher. Also, some agreements stipulate that if a student elects to take a course at a CJC/IHL, then the cost of the course will be assumed by the parent unless state appropriated, private or grant funds are available. It should be noted that a good mix of community college instructors and high school teachers provide for a balance in the funds paid out and those received.

- **Textbook Adoption Timetables**

While school districts are responsible for the purchase of their students' textbooks, the two entities can come to an agreement on a reasonable length of time for the use of "class sets" of dual credit textbooks. If for example, districts can be guaranteed use of a set of textbooks for 3 years from the time of purchase, the enormous cost associated with textbooks can be greatly diminished. In addition, parties could negotiate in the local agreements to utilize the same texts and when there is a desire to use a different text, it would become the responsibility of that party to purchase selected texts. With the exception of those areas with rapidly changing technology (which can be specified in the agreement), most academic texts can be used effectively for much longer than they typically are used. Though this may involve compromise on the part of the instructors, it does not compromise the quality or integrity of the course.

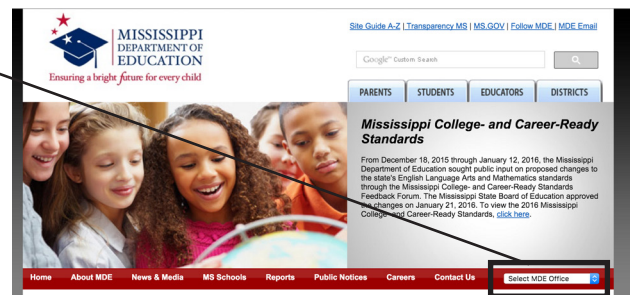

Every counselor should be able to access MSIS course codes with a personal log-in.

If you do not have a log-in, ask for assistance from your district MSIS data manager. In order to generate the Approved Secondary Course Codes Report, please follow these steps:

1. From the website (www.mdek12.org), select Technology and Strategic Services from the drop-down menu on the right side of the red navigation bar.



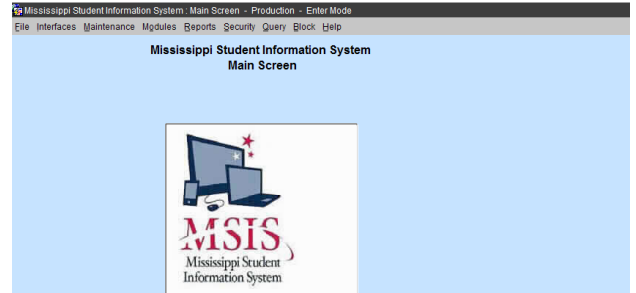
2. Choose MSIS Log-on from the left side of the Office of Technology and Strategic Services page.
NOTE: Your browser may prompt you to “Run” or “Trust” Java in order to launch the MSIS log-on.



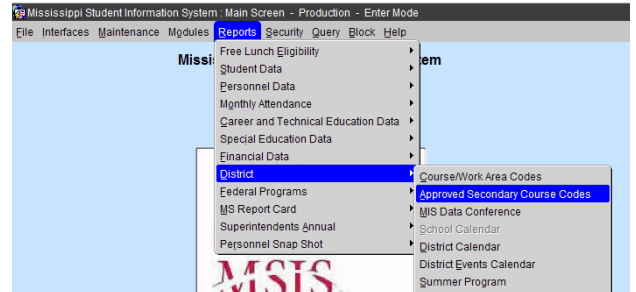
3. Log-on to MSIS, making sure to use the appropriate credentials. In the “Database” field, type MSIS.



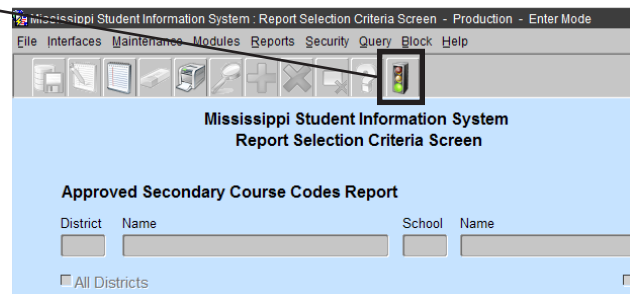
- Once you have logged in, you should see the main view page.



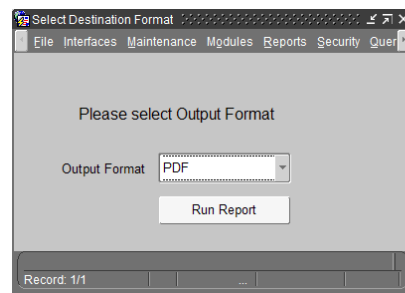
- In the Menu bar at the top of the screen, choose Reports > District > Approved Secondary Course Codes.
