

CSI- Comprehensive Support and Improvement

- Grad Rate 67% or below
- Lowest 5% Title I Schools (based on 3 years of data)
- Non-exiting Title I ATSI Schools (Fall 2023)



CSI- Comprehensive Support and Improvement (Fall 2023)

- Grad rate above 67%, or
- 3-year average performance above lowest 5% of Title IA schools, <u>and</u> any increase over the identification year accountability score
- Non-Exiting ATSI Not Applicable for Fall 2023

CSI- Comprehensive Support and Improvement (Fall 2026)

- Grad rate above 67%, or
- 3-year average performance above lowest 5% of Title IA schools, and increase in letter grade or increase that crosses over the midpoint of the letter grade
- (Non-Exiting ATSI) Average subgroup performance (3-year avg) above the bottom 5% Title I schools, and increase in letter grade or increase that crosses over the midpoint of the letter grade







