Background Information:

Mississippi State University (MSU) is requesting approval of new approved programs for the following Career Technical Education (CTE) licenses:

917 – Career Pathway Experience 981 – ICT I	952 – Career Pathway: Finance and Accounting
982 – ICT II	955 – Career Pathway: Business
984 – Technology Foundations	Management
	956 – Career Pathway: Marketing
	193 – Economics
	111 – Computer Applications

The Department of Instructional Systems and Workforce Development at MSU revised two methods courses to prepare students for the new endorsements. These courses are (1) TKT 4183/6183 Methods of Teaching Career Pathway Experience and (2) TKT 4463/6436 Methods of Teaching Technology in the Middle School. Currently, a Career Technical earns endorsements 952, 955, 956, 193 and 111 by completing training at the Research and Curriculum Unit at MSU.

All internal and external reviewers approved the proposal. On November 2, 2012, the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and Development (the Commission) approved the proposal for 917, 981, 982 and 984. On January 11, 2013, the Commission approved the proposal for 952, 955, 956, 193 and 111.

#### Briefly state your rationale:

The modification to the TTE degree is needed for the following reasons:

- Changes in the Career and Technical Education (CTE) endorsements have affected the TTE degree and updates are needed to allow TTE graduates to pursue teaching positions in CTE. Specifically, the modification provides for the new endorsements in Information and Communication Technology I (981), Information and Communication Technology II (982), Technology Foundations (984), Career Pathway Experience (917) and the three business career pathways—Finance and Accounting (952), Business Management (955), and Marketing (956). Syllabi are attached that document content in these endorsement areas.
- 2. The requirements for the Master Teacher of Economics (MTE) will be provided to Technology Teacher Education/Business Technology majors through collaboration with the Mississippi Council on Economic Education and the Center for Economic Education and Financial Literacy at Mississippi State University. A letter of support from Selena Swartzfager, President of Mississippi Council on Economic Education is attached. TTE majors completing the MTE requirements would qualify for the 193 Economics endorsement.
- 3. We are also requesting a modification to the 111 Computer Applications supplemental endorsement to include TKT 4463 Methods of Teaching Technology in the Middle School as an alternate choice of one of the required courses. It seemed logical to include a methods course in middle school technology as one of the 111 course requirements. If this proposal is approved, the TTE major would also complete all requirements for the 111 endorsement to teach computer applications in their degree program.

#### Other Institutions with Similar Programs

Dr. Diane Fisher at the University of Southern Mississippi is the coordinator for their business teacher education degree. Dr. Connie Forde and Dr. Fisher have collaborated in the revision of the two business teacher education programs in the state. Dr. Fisher will also be proposing the same proposal for modification of her program.

NOTE: Program approval is subject to standard review procedures that involve several entities and, therefore, timelines for final approval may vary. After TAP approves the program proposal, it may then be subject to presentation for approval by the Licensure Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and Development and the State Board of Education before program candidates are eligible for Mississippi Teacher Licensure.

As coordinator of the Technology Teacher Education program at Mississippi State University and department head for the Department of Instructional Systems and Workforce Development, I am requesting that the newly revised methods course TKT 4463/6463 Teaching Technology in the Middle School be accepted as a methods course required for the "add on" endorsement for 981 Information and Communication Technology I, 982 Information and Communication Technology II, and 984 Technology Foundations. The attached syllabus shows that the methods course includes learning objectives related to the curricular content of the three technology frameworks (ICT I, ICT II, and Technology Foundations), pedagogy for middle school students, relevant instructional strategies related to technology, IC<sup>3</sup> preparation, keyboarding proficiency examination, and appropriate formative and summative assessments.

For the past few years, our department has offered TKT 4463/6463 Methods of ICT I for the 981 methods course with documented keyboarding proficiency and TKT 4863/6863 Methods of ICT II for the 982 methods course with documented keyboarding proficiency. During the past year, we have revised TKT 4463/6463 to include ICT I, ICT II, and Technology Foundations. This upcoming fall 2012 semester, we are offering the *modified* TKT 4463/6463 Teaching Technology in the Middle School that combines ICT I, ICT II, and Technology Foundations and therefore are seeking approval for this course to serve as the approved methods course required for endorsement in these areas.

Upon completion of the course, the student will have completed:

1. the middle school technology methods course (documented by MSU transcript)

- a keyboarding proficiency test (documented by keyboarding proficiency certificate signed by course instructor that verifies the minimum 30 net words per minute using the touch methods as required by the endorsement)
- 3. the IC<sup>3</sup> exam certificate (documented by certificate with passing scores).

In the event that the student does not pass the keyboarding proficiency (30 net words per minute) or pass the  $IC^3$  exam, the instructor will not present certificates for the student to attach to the endorsement application. Absence of the certificates will alert the Office of Licensure that these requirements have not been met.
