G. Approval to Enter into an Agreement with the Mississippi Community College Foundation to Continue to Administer the Alternate Route Teacher Certification Program Known as the Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality Teachers (MAPQT) for the 2013-14 School Year

Specifications:

In 2005, the State Board approved the MS Alternate Path to Quality Teachers (MAPQT) Program to alternatively train and license K-12 teachers. The contract was awarded at that time to the Mississippi Community College Foundation (MCCF) to produce and operate this program under the supervision of MDE. The State Board is being asked to consider approval of the Memorandum of Agreement between the MCCF and MDE to operate the MAPQT alternate route teacher program for the 2013-2014 school year.

What is MAPQT?

To combat the shortage of secondary teachers in the state, the Mississippi Community College Foundation sponsors the Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality Teachers program each year in June. The three week, ninety hour training session is held Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. June 10-28, 2013. This program is designed as alternative teacher training for those who hold a non-education degree, but desire to become classroom instructors.

During the ninety clock-hour workshops, participants will receive training from nationally board-certified teachers in skills essential for being successful in the classroom.

Participants will be required to complete a portfolio, which will be beneficial to them as they seek employment.

Workshop topics include:

- Effective Teaching Strategies
- State Curriculum Frameworks
- > Planning and Instruction
- Classroom Management Skills
- Use of Technology in Instruction



Who is eligible?

Program applicants must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Hold an undergraduate bachelor's degree from a nationally/regionally accredited institution of higher learning; (Individuals who graduated from a college prior to 2007 must have a minimum of a 2.0 over-all GPA. Individuals who graduated from a college since 2007
- must have a minimum of a
 2.5 overall GPA or a 2.75
 GPA in major.)
- 3. Have passing scores on Praxis I
- 4. Have passing score on Praxis II, Specialty Area Test in area of endorsement.

<u>Does successful completion of the MAPQT program lead to a teaching license?</u>

Successful completion of the summer program and documentation of employment by a local school district qualifies the participant for a one-year alternate path teaching license. In order to receive a five-year teaching license, the new teacher must successfully complete the following during the first teaching year:

- 1. New Teacher Practicum –
 Attendance is required at nine
 Saturday sessions held monthly
 during the first year of
 teaching. The focus of the New
 Teacher Practicum is to provide
 additional training in classroom
 management, peer coaching,
 school law, data analysis,
 methods for improving
 instruction, and other issues
 that new teachers may
 encounter.
- 2. Local school district mentoring and first year teacher intensive induction program
- Completion of peer, mentor, and program coordinator observations
- Completion of all required assignments to be included in the first year teacher's portfolio

MAPQT Program Costs

Tuition: \$2,000 breakdown as follows...

- Application Fee: \$50.00 (will apply toward tuition fee if accepted and is nonrefundable)
- Summer Session: \$1250 which includes training, manual, resource book, and materials.
- Fee due date: May 15, 2013
- Late payment fee: Any payments received after May 15, 2013 will be charged a \$20 late fee.

Saturday session fees only apply to participants who secure a teaching position.

Saturday Session: **\$700**/ can be paid in two installments

- 1st installment of \$350 will be due September 10, 2013
- 2nd installment of \$350 will be due November 10, 2013

WIN Job centers in your area can also assist with program costs with WIA funding. Check with your closest WIN Job Center for more information.

Some school districts also provide tuition reimbursement assistance.
