## Discussion to allow Carnegie unit credit in Mississippi Studies and Geography in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade beginning school year 2013-2014.

The Office of Career and Technical Education requests the Accreditation Commission to consider a change to allow Mississippi Studies and Geography to be taught at the 8<sup>th</sup> grade level for ½ Carnegie credit each for high school graduation purposes.

This course has been typically taught at the 9<sup>th</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup> grade level; however, there is an increasing demand for it to also be offered to 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. In addition to the demand for these classes in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade, typically in Excellence for All pilot schools, Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) already allows for Mississippi Studies credit earned before high school to be accepted for admission provided content is the same as the high school course. The reference to Mississippi Studies pre-high school is also referenced in House Bill 425 – "Required Course Work for Student Tuition Assistance Grant."

Allowing students, who choose to do so, to complete Mississippi Studies and/or Geography at the 8<sup>th</sup> grade will allow students to explore greater opportunities at the high school level in their selected pathways. Allowing high school credit will provide even greater incentive for students to plan their high school pathway.
