 D. Approval to revise Process Standard 20 – Instructional Management System, of the Mississippi Public School Accountability Standards, 2014 [Goals 2 and 4 – MDE Strategic Plan]

(Has cleared the Administrative Procedures Act process with no public comment)

On April 14, 2015, the Commission on School Accreditation approved the proposed revisions to Process Standard 20 – *Instructional Management System*, of the *Mississippi Public School Accountability Standards*, 2014.

The Office of Elementary Education presented proposed revisions to Process Standard 20, *Instructional Management System*, to the Commission on School Accreditation for approval.

On July 16, 2015 the State Board of Education granted approval to begin the APA process to revise Process Standard 20 to emphasize the following requirements of the Instructional Management System:

- 1) Requires approval of the local school board;
- 2) Includes the competencies and objectives required in the curriculum frameworks approved by the State Board of Education;
- 3) Ensure the frameworks are available to all teachers;
- 4) Includes a tiered instructional model in accordance with State Board Policy 4300, including academic and behavioral interventions, and
- 5) Meets requirements of the Literacy-Based Promotion Act.

The MDE is seeking an additional revision to Process Standard 20 to exempt Districts Meeting the Highest Levels of Performance (A and B Performance Classifications) from Process Standard 20.1, Instructional Management System.

This item references Goals 2 and 4 of the *Mississippi Department of Education* 2016-2020 Strategic Plan.

PROPOSED REVISIONS TO PROCESS STANDARD 20 MISSISSIPPI PUBLIC SCHOOL ACCOUNTABILTY STANDARDS, 2014

Existing Language:

20. The school district implements an instructional management system that has been adopted by the school board and includes, at a minimum, the competencies and objectives required in the curriculum frameworks approved by the State Board of Education that are available to all teachers in each school. (Districts Meeting the Highest Levels of Performance are exempted.) {MS Code 37-3-49(2)(a-c) and 37-3-49(5)} (SB Policy 4300).

Proposed Language:

- 20. The school district meets the following instructional management requirements (MS Code 37-3-49(2)(a-c) and 37-3-49(5)) (SB Policy 4300):
 - 20.1 The school district implements an instructional management system that has been adopted by the school board and includes, at a minimum, the competencies and objectives required in the curriculum frameworks approved by the State Board of Education that are available to all teachers in each school. (Districts Meeting the Highest Levels of Performance are exempted.)
 - 20.2 The instructional management system includes a tiered instructional model in accordance with State Board of Education Policy 4300, including academic interventions, behavioral interventions, and *Literacy-Based Promotion Act* requirements.

Note: Districts Meeting the Highest Level of Performance is defined as A and B Performance Classifications.
