02. Action: Approval by the SBE to extend the funding period of 2018-2019 McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children and Youth Program awards as a result of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), March 27, 2020 [Goals 1and 2 – MBE Strategic Plan]

On March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) was signed into law. The legislation included the provision of waivers to State Educational Agencies, extending the period of performance for grants authorized by the *Every Student Succeeds Act* and the *McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children and Youth Program.* On April 21, 2020, the United States Department of Education granted the MDE a waiver approval to extend FY19 (school year 2018-2019) McKinney-Vento program funds.

<u>Background and Purpose</u>: The McKinney-Vento program is designed to address the problems that homeless children and youth have faced in enrolling, attending, and succeeding in school. Grants are awarded to local educational agencies to ensure that homeless children, including preschoolers and youth, receive a free and appropriate public education and support services to eliminate barriers to academic success. Services will include but are not limited to the provision of supplemental instruction, transportation, free school meals, enriched education services, social services, and medical referrals.

It is the recommendation of the MDE that the SBE grant a no-cost extension to allow school districts to expend FY19 McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children and Youth Program grant funds through January 1, 2021.
