Background Information: In accordance with *Every Student Succeeds Act* (ESSA) Section 1111h(1)c PL 95-117, the Division of Research and Development has calculated and produced achievement gap data by subgroup for each school district using the 2016 Mississippi Assessment Program (MAP) results. The achievement gap has been calculated using student achievement at proficient and above for both the state and district level and is disaggregated for the following subgroups:

- All Students
- Major Racial & Ethnic groups
- Students with Disabilities
- Limited English Proficient
- Economically disadvantaged
- Gender

This item references Goals 1, 2, 4, and 6 of the *Mississippi Board of Education 2016-2020 Strategic Plan*.

Understanding Subgroup Performance

Top Line: Subgroup performance differences are provided to illuminate educational access and opportunity gaps among students in the 144 public school districts in the State of Mississippi.

Tool: Subgroup performance is displayed using a graphical representation of student achievement called a “heat map”. The three colors (red, amber, green) provide the reader with an intuitive understanding of the relative performance of a particular subgroup of students in relationship to the state average.

Rule of Thumb: Large positive numbers in red suggest very large gaps. Small positive or negative (reverse gap¹) numbers in green suggest no real gaps.

¹ A reverse gap means the particular subgroup (e.g., students with disabilities) outperformed the referent group. Further, gap analysis is limited in its explanatory power when no referent group is available (e.g., all students are economically disadvantaged) or the reference group is very small (i.e., less than 30 students).

Background: The Mississippi Department of Education annually produces reports on the percentage of students meeting or exceeding the “high water mark” (*Proficiency* or *Advanced*) on its statewide assessments. These aggregate data points are provided to reflect how well students are mastering the skills and knowledge necessary to be considered fully proficient and ready for the next grade or course that requires additional, more complex understanding and application. However, performance on the state’s assessments is not uniformly distributed among different student characteristics, specifically students from economically disadvantaged households and/or those learning English. The aforementioned student characteristics are well documented in the literature beginning as early as the Coleman Report (*Equality of Educational Opportunity*, 1966) has illuminated the general public of the considerable performance gaps among students. In 2001, the Congress passed P.L. 107-110 (*No Child Left Behind*) with a particular emphasis in Section 1111 on evaluating the performance of subgroups and holding schools and districts accountable for the identified students making adequate yearly progress. This federal mandate continues in the recent reauthorization of the *Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965* through the passage of P.L. 114-95 (Every Student Succeeds Act). Specifically, Section 1111(b)(2) requires the reporting of the following: (a) each major racial and ethnic group, (b) economically disadvantaged students as compared to students who are not economically disadvantaged, (c) children with disabilities as compared to children without disabilities, (d) English proficiency status, (e) gender, and (f) migrant status. The implied purpose of examining the aforementioned subgroups is to identify and ameliorate performance discrepancies, thus promoting equitable opportunities for all students.

Technical Notes:

Gap analysis compares the percentage of proficient students between subgroups, such as comparing the percentage of proficient white students to the percentage of proficient African American students. The purpose of gap analysis is to show the disparity between the groups being compared. The gap percentage points are calculated by finding the difference between the percentage of proficient students in the groups being compared. (e.g., White 47.5% - African American 21.0% = 26.5 point gap)

Example:

% Proficient of Students With Disabilities = 15.8%

% Proficient of Students Without Disabilities = 46.2%

% Point Gap of Students With Disabilities = 46.2 - 15.8 = 30.4
