I. Agreed Orders

Based on discussion with Counsel for OEM, on a motion by David Martin, seconded by Jamie Creel, the Commission Hearing Subcommittee unanimously voted to enter into executive session for investigative proceedings regarding allegations of misconduct or violations of law by Mr. Quinton Parker, specifically to protect the confidentiality of students' personally identifiable information and/or education records in accordance with state and federal law.

After all exhibits were received into evidence and testimony heard, Jamie Creel moved that the Commission Hearing Subcommittee change the purpose of why it is in executive session for deliberation and findings concerning the license of Educator, Quinton Parker. Shelly Simmons seconded the motion and the Commission Hearing Subcommittee unanimously voted to go into executive session.
