Failure to complete the ethics course and review the presentation on the Mississippi Educator Code of Ethics within one (1) year from the date of this decision shall result in the automatic suspension of Educator License No. 202946 for a period of one (1) year and require a reinstatement hearing before the Commission in accordance with Miss. Code Ann. § 37-3-2 (14)(a) and the Rules of Procedure Governing Disciplinary Proceedings of the Commission.
