


| "In <i>The Seven Chinese Sisters</i> , Sixth Sister could cook the most delicious noodle soup. How did she know how to make the soup?" | Show illustrations. Children respond. |
| "A recipe is directions for making food. A cookbook is a book of recipes . Here are some cookbooks . What do you notice?" | Show books. Children respond. |
| "A recipe usually lists all the ingredients and also how much you will need of each ingredient ." | Point to the ingredients listed in the recipe and read them out. |
| "After the list of ingredients there is a description of the steps needed to make the dish ." | Read steps from the recipe. |
| "Sometimes families have recipes for special dishes they like the best. Noodle soup might be a favorite of the Seven Sisters, and they might have gotten the recipe from someone in their family." | |
| "If a family has many recipes , they could create a cookbook ." | |
