Let's Find Out About It:		
Preparation: Set up materials.		
"In <i>The Little Red Hen (Makes a Pizza),</i> the hen needed ingredients and other things. What do you notice?"	Show illustrations. Children respond.	
"She needed a flat <i>pan</i> for her pizza. The <i>pan</i> is metal, and it gets very hot in an oven. The pizza ingredients need to be <i>baked</i> - cooked in an oven."	Show illustrations.	
"When you prepare other kinds of food, like, you need different <i>cookware</i> and <i>utensils</i> . Here are <i>pots, pans,</i> and <i>utensils</i> . What do you notice?"	Show and name cookware and utensils and/or show images. Children respond.	
"Why would you use this(loaf pan) for <i>baking</i> (bread)?"	Children respond.	
"If you wanted to cookwhich of these cooking utensils would you use? Why?"	Children respond. Continue with two or three more examples. Guide children to understand that the shape and material of the cookware/utensils is relevant.
