## Day 1

## Numeracy:

Number Jump

Hold up an appropriate number of fingers and write the corresponding numeral for children to see.

Jump safely $\qquad$ many times. We are going to count all together in unison.

Repeat with another numeral between 1 and 10.
Variation (Subitizing Version): Hide your hands behind your back.

Jump only if I hold up three fingers.
Show your fingers for enough time for all children to see, and have children jump 3 times.

## How Many Now?:

We are going to play a game with counters and numbers.

Show the children three counters and count them together. Display the same numeral card that matches the counters.

How many counters are there? Does this numeral card match? Watch. I am going to add one more counter. How many are there now? Let's count them all together. Does this numeral card match?

Repeat the process. Alternate adding and removing a counter.

## Day 2

## Numeracy:

Little Bird
Recite the poem together.

One little bird with lovely feathers blue (Show first finger.) Sat beside another one, then there were two.
(Show second finger.)
Two little birds singing in the tree.
Another came to join them, then there were three.
(Show third finger.)
Three little birds wishing there were more. Along came another bird, then there were four.
(Show fourth finger.)

Four little birds, glad to be alive, found a lonely friend, then there were five. (Show fifth finger.)

Five little birds picking up sticks. Along came a helper, then there were six. (Show one hand and a finger on the other.)

Six little birds looking up to heaven.
Another bird joined them, then there were seven.
(Show one hand and two fingers on the other.)

Seven little birds, just as happy as can be. Seven little birds singing songs for you and me.

## Numeral 7:

I Spy Two Eyes or Where's One?

Read aloud the Big Book I Spy Two Eyes or Where's One?

Return to the numeral 7 page, asking children how many of a certain object totals a count of 7 on those pages.

Let's make the numeral 7 in the air! It has two parts. At the top, start from the left. Make a straight line across and from the end of that line, down, in a slanted line to the bottom.

Recite the poem together.
One little bird with lovely feathers blue (Show first finger.)
Sat beside another one, then there were two.
(Show second finger.)
Two little birds singing in the tree. Another came to join them, then there were three.
(Show third finger.)

## Numeral 8: <br> I Spy Two Eyes or Where's One?

Read aloud the Big Book I Spy Two Eyes or Where's One?

Return to the numeral 8 page, asking children how many of a certain object totals 8 on those pages. Lead children in counting aloud to check.

Let's make the numeral 8 in the air! You can make it two ways. It looks like two circles, one on top of the other, or by writing the capital letter $S$ and then curving back to the start.

## Numeracy: <br> Number Jumps (Numerals)

Hold up an appropriate numeral card for all children to see.

What numeral is this? That's right! It is $\qquad$ -.

Jump safely $\qquad$ many times.
We are going to count all together in unison.

Repeat with another appropriate numeral card between 1 and 10.

How Many Now? (Hidden Version):

Today we are going to play How Many Now? in a different way!

Show the children three counters, count them together, and cover them with a cloth.

How many counters are there? Watch. I am going to add one more counter. How many are there now?

Have children respond by showing you with their fingers. Uncover the counters and display the matching numeral card.

Let's count them all together. Does this numeral card match?

Repeat the process. Alternate adding and removing a counter and, eventually, adding and removing two counters.
