The author is Bobbie Kalman - she wrote the words."	Show cover. Point to the title and author's name. Read book. Summarize certain pages to maintain children's focus and interest.
"What are some of the ways that we learned water is important to living things?"	Children respond. Show pages that correspond with children's answers.
"A <i>drought</i> is when there is not enough water in a place. People and animals don't have enough water to drink, and <i>plants</i> don't have enough water to grow."	Show cover. Point out how dry the land looks on the cover and the many animals/people that would depend on the rain/water. Read some or all of the book.
" <i>Bringing the Rain to Kapiti Plain</i> is about a <i>drought</i> that happened in Africa."	Summarize certain pages to maintain children's focus and interest.
