	habitat: where animals or people live	

Let's Find Out About It:			
Preparation: Set up materials.			
"In <i>Rabbits and Raindrops</i> , the rabbits were protected from the rain by the hedge. What do you notice?"	Show illustrations. Children respond.		
"Here are some other animals in their habitats - where they live. What do you notice?"	Show images. Children respond.		
"The animals are camouflaged - their coverings - their fur, feathers, or scales are a similar color to their habitats . This makes it difficult for other animals to see them. Why is it helpful if another animal can't see them?"	Children respond.		
"Some animals are predators - they eat other animals for food. Because they are camouflaged , they can sneak up on their prey - the animals they eat - without being seen."	Show images.		
"Camouflage helps animals that are prey hide from their predators."	Show images.
