

Let's Find Out About It:	
<i>Preparation: Set up materials.</i>	
"In <i>Max's Dragon Shirt</i> , Max and his sister Ruby went to the department store to buy a new pair of pants. Max got lost. What do you notice?"	Show illustrations. Children respond.
"A tool that could have helped Max is a map . Here are images of maps . What do you notice?"	Show images. Children respond.
"A map is an illustration that shows where things are."	
"A map has a title like a book. A map also has symbols - pictures and colors that represent things on the map . The person who creates a map is a cartographer ."	Show map.
"On this map , the cartographer drew a picnic table symbol . Why do you think she did that?"	Show zoo map from Resource. Children respond.
"A key explains what the symbols on a map represent. What do you notice?"	Point to key. Children respond.
