Let's Find Out About It:			
Preparation: Set up materials.			
"In <i>Max's Dragon Shirt</i> , Max and his sister Ruby went to the department store to buy a new pair of pants. Max got lost. What do you notice?"	Show illustrations. Children respond.		
"A <b>tool</b> that could have helped Max is a <b>map</b> . Here are images of <b>maps</b> . What do you notice?"	Show images. Children respond.		
"A <b>map</b> is an illustration that shows where things are."			
"A <b>map</b> has a title like a book. A map also has <b>symbols</b> - pictures and colors that represent things on the <b>map</b> . The person who creates a <b>map</b> is a <b>cartographer</b> ."	Show map.		
"On this <b>map</b> , the <b>cartographer</b> drew a picnic table <b>symbol</b> . Why do you think she did that?"	Show zoo map from Resource. Children respond.		
"A <b>key</b> explains what the <b>symbols</b> on a <b>map</b> represent. What do you notice?"	Point to key. Children respond.
