Alphabet Memory Game (*Medium Support*)

Enduring Understanding(s):

- Color can carry information.

Essential Question(s):

- How are colors used to communicate ideas, thoughts and feelings?

| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 3 sets of laminated upper- and lowercase cards (see Resource) | <p>lowercase: letters that are not capital</p> <p>match: to be the same</p> <p>memory: an experience, person, or thing one remembers</p> <p>same: alike in every way</p> <p>uppercase: capital letters</p> |

| Procedure |
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| <p>Preparation: <i>Make multiple sets of upper- and lowercase cards and laminate them. Put masking tape down the middle of the table to designate the two groups of cards for children to choose from.</i></p> <p>Procedure: Pair children to play a memory game with upper- and lowercase letters and distribute one set of cards to each pair. Show materials. Model setting cards face down on the table, divided by masking tape. Model turning over two cards, removing them if they match, turning them back over if they do not.</p> <p>Encourage children to name the letters and their letter sounds.</p> |
