I like to eat, eat, eat apples and bananas.**

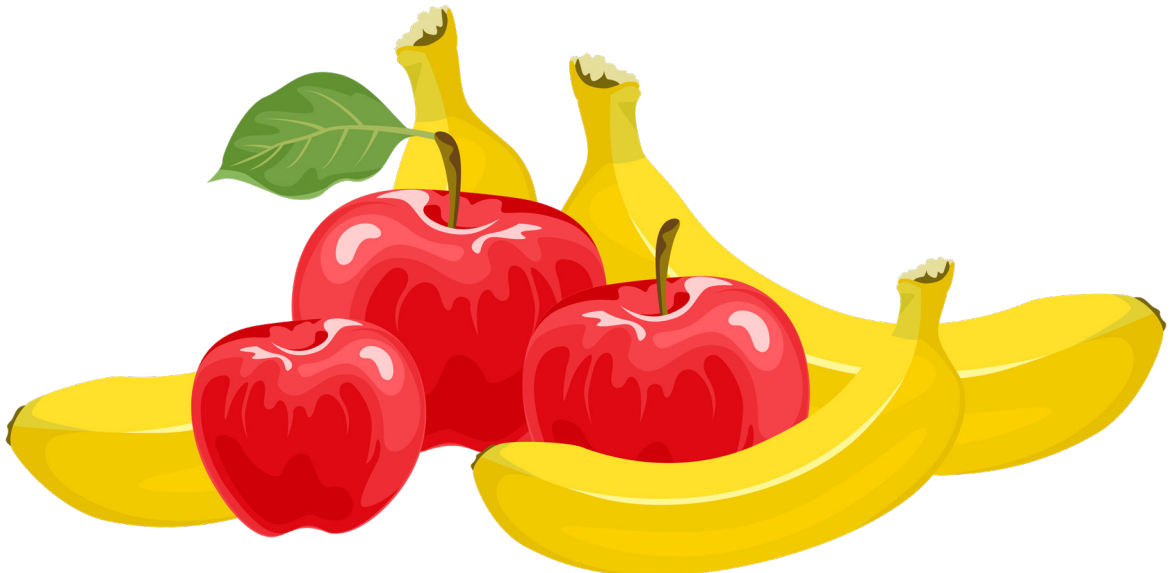

(Move forearms left to right like windshield wipers.)

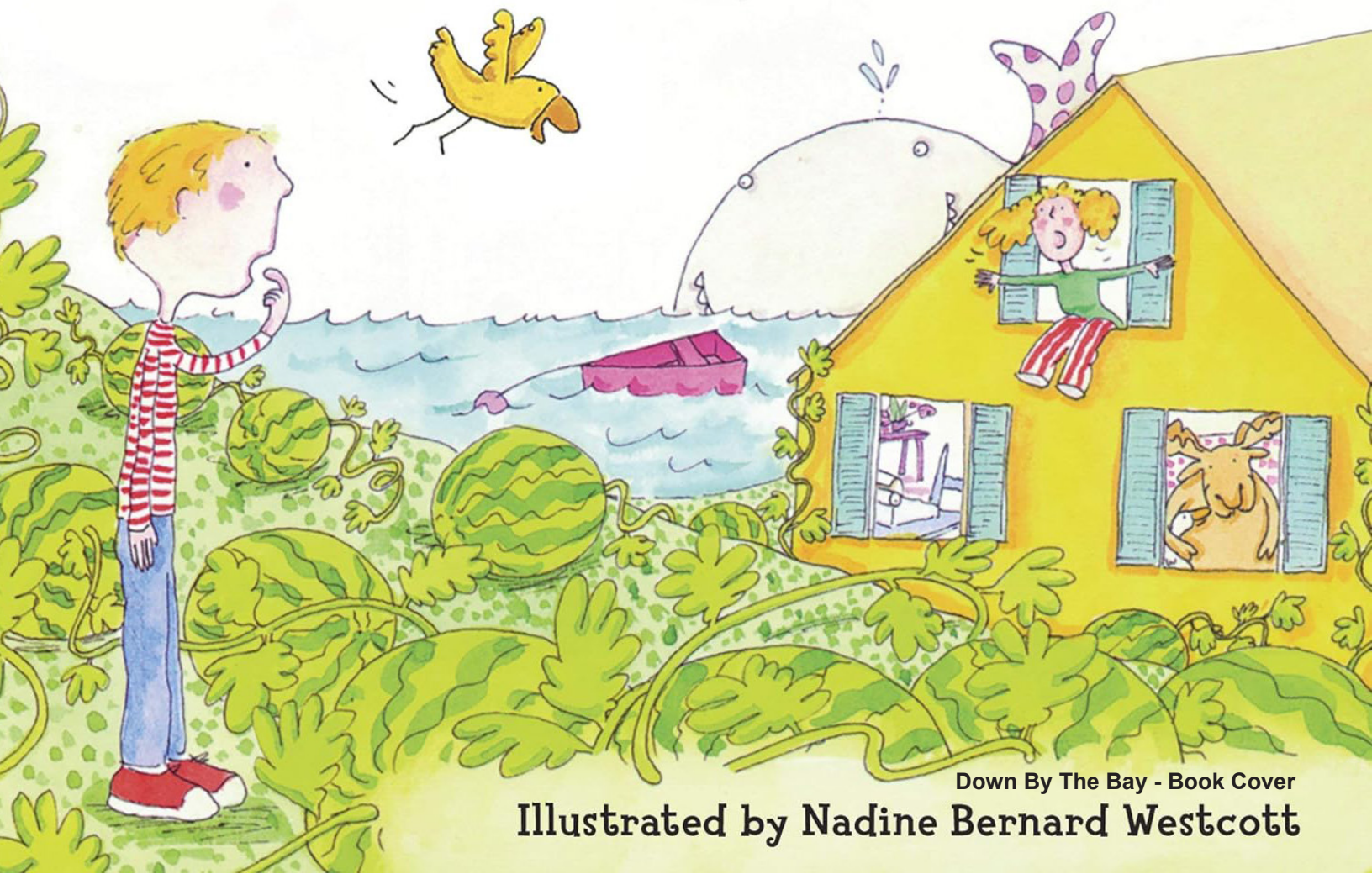
**The driver on the bus says, "Move on back!",

On a snowy day.



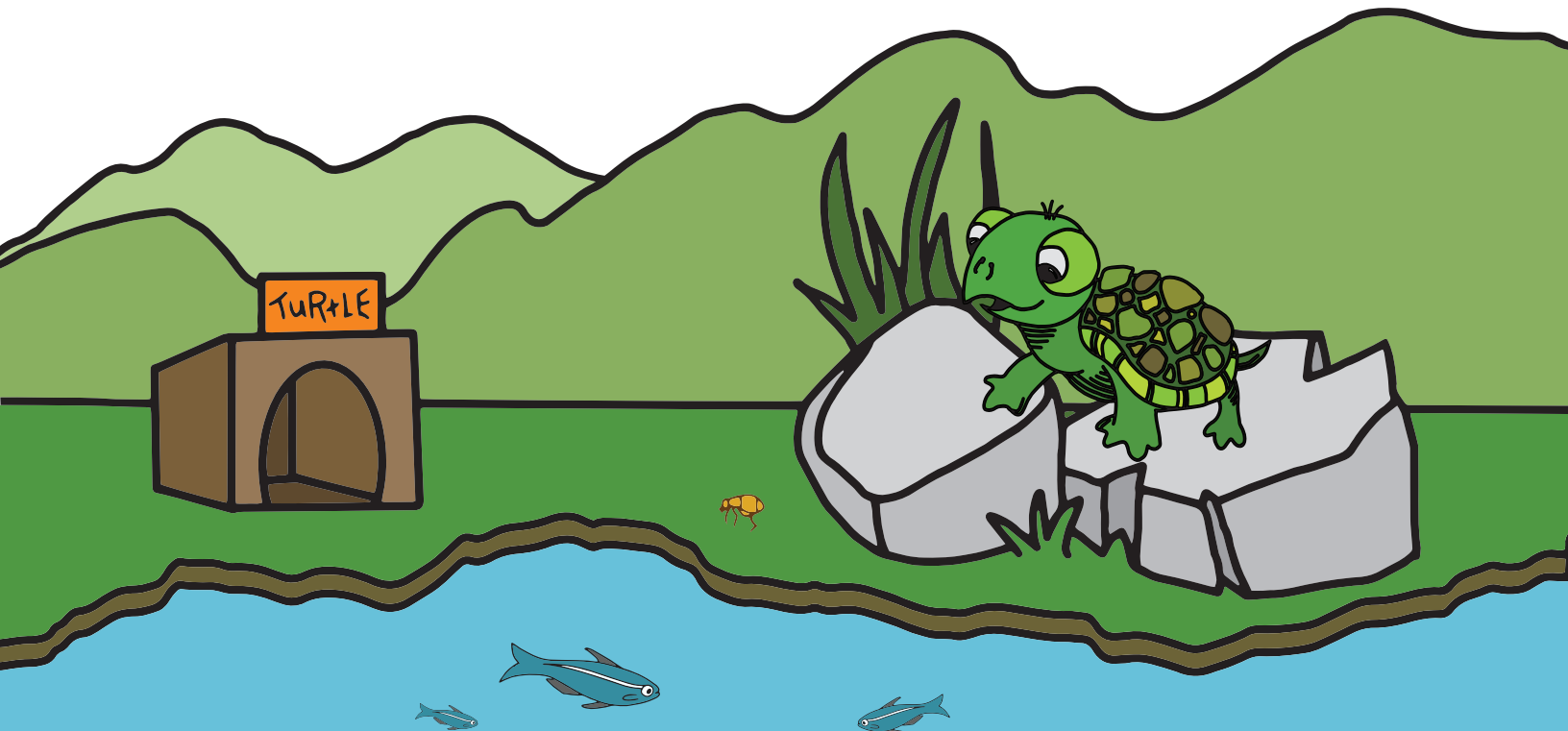
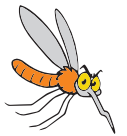


# The Little Turtle



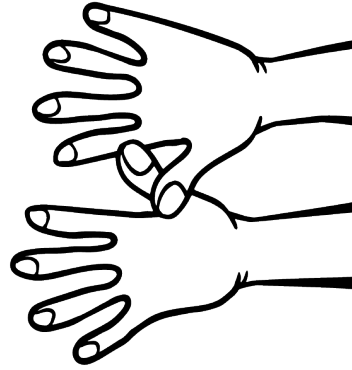

# Ten Little Fingers

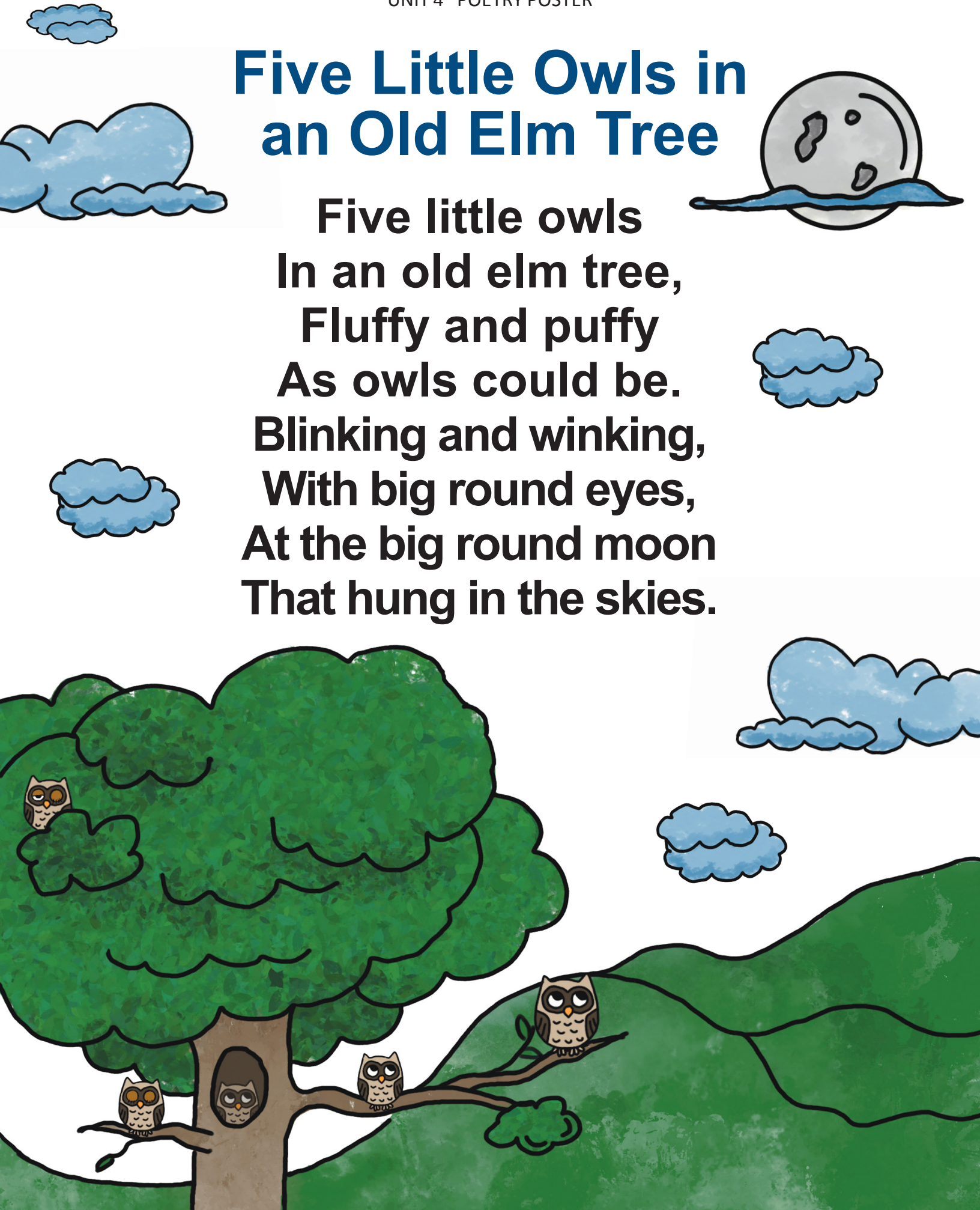
I have ten little fingers,
