

## Essential Question(s):

- What are sources of light?

Materials	Vocabulary	Books
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><i>Play with Me</i></li> <li><i>Raccoon on His Own</i></li> <li>images of natural and artificial light sources (see Resource)</li> </ul>	<p><b>artificial:</b> made by people</p> <p><b>lightbulb:</b> a device used to make light</p> <p><b>natural:</b> real, not made up</p> <p><b>source:</b> where it comes from</p> <p><b>reflection:</b> an image you can see in a mirror or in glass or water</p> <p><b>surface:</b> the outside layer of an object</p>	 

Let's Find Out About It:	
Preparation: Set up materials	
"In <i>Raccoon on His Own</i> and <i>Play with Me</i> , the raccoon and the girl saw their <b>reflections</b> . What do you notice?"	Show illustrations. <b>Children respond.</b>
"The light from the sun shone on the water's <b>surface</b> and created <b>reflections</b> ."	
"Here are images of light <b>sources</b> - where it comes from. What do you notice?"	Show images. <b>Children respond.</b>
"A light <b>source</b> can be <b>natural</b> - like the sun. A light <b>source</b> can be <b>artificial</b> - made by people - like a <b>lightbulb</b> ."	
"What <b>natural/artificial</b> light <b>sources</b> do you see in our classroom?"	<b>Children respond.</b>
