Let's Find Out About It:		
Preparation: Set up materials		
"In Raccoon on His Own, the raccoon family went out to look for food. In Kitten's First Full Moon, the kitten went out to look for food. What do you notice?"	Show illustrations. Children respond.	
"Raccoons are usually nocturnal animals - they stay awake at night and sleep during the day."		
"Cats are usually diurnal animals - awake during the day and asleep at night."		
"Here are images of nocturnal and diurnal animals. What do you notice?"	Show images. Children respond.	
"Here are some images of nocturnal and diurnal animals. How can we act like nocturnal and diurnal animals?"	Show images, pausing in places for children to act out the animals' descriptions, i.e., big eyes, sneaking, etc. Children respond.
