Let's Find Out About It:			
Preparation: Set up materials			
"In <i>Kitten's First Full Moon</i> , the kitten saw a bowl of milk in the water. What do you notice?"	Show illustrations. Children respond.		
"The moonlight shone on the water's <b>shiny surface</b> and made a <b>reflection</b> . What do you notice when the moon <b>shone</b> on the kitten?"	Show illustrations. Children respond.		
"The moon <b>shone</b> on the kitten and created her <b>reflection</b> in the water in front of her. Behind her was her <b>shadow</b> ."			
"Here are images of <b>reflections</b> and <b>shadows</b> ."	Show images.		
"How are <b>reflections</b> the same as or different from <b>shadows</b> ?"	Record and summarize children's responses on chart paper.
