# What's Growing in the Neighborhood: (Related to Zinnia's Flower Garden)

Take a walk around your neighborhood and notice different things that are growing such as flowers, plants, neighbors' gardens, maybe even babies! Take photos of things that grow. Invite your child to draw and tell you about what s/he noticed.

#### **Conversation starters:**

- What did you notice?
- What do different things (plants, animals, people) need to grow?
- What would you like to grow? Why?

#### Math

#### Count and Move (Forward and Back):

Take turns with your child looking for objects of different numbers. Start in a crouched position and slowly rise to a standing position while counting aloud to 10 or more. Then, counting backward from 10 or more, slowly sink back down.

### **Literacy**

**Song Together:** This is a song your child should be familiar with. Use hand motions and fingers for the numbers as you count down.

### Talk and Read Together

#### **Conversation Starters:**

- What do you think this book will be about?
- What is your favorite part of the story?
- What is the first thing that happens in the story?
- What do you think will happen next?
- What is your favorite character?



#### **Gross Motor**

**Life Cycle of a Plant:** (Related to *Zinnia's Flower Garden*)

Ask your child what kind of plant they would like to be. Pretend your child is the seed and you are the gardener. Plant the seed (child) in the ground, cover with soil, sprinkle with water, and warm with the sun's rays. Encourage your child to act out growing into a seedling and then grow into a flower, tree, or vegetable plant. Switch roles.

#### **Conversation Starters:**

- What kind of plant are you?
- What is the first thing that needs to happen? What happens next?
