Essential Question(s):


How do living things respond and adapt to their environments?

Materials

Vocabulary

- Zinnia's Flower Garden
- images of desert gardens (see Resource)

Books



cactus: a desert plant that stores water

climate: the weather in an area over a long time

desert: a dry, sandy place with very little rain

garden: a section of ground where herbs, fruit, flowers, or vegetables are grown

moist: a little wet; damp

needle: the sharp, pointy part of a cactus

plant: a living thing that grows in the ground using the sun for food

protect: to keep safe

root: part of the plant that is usually hidden underground

soil: a mixture of minerals, water, air, and organic matter

waxy: covered in wax-like material

Let's Find Out About It:	
Preparation: Set up materials.	
"In <i>Zinnia's Flower Garden</i> and <i>The Ugly Vegetables</i> , Zinnia, the girl, and her mother planted gardens . What do you notice?"	Show illustrations. Children respond.
"The plants in their garden needed water and protection."	Show images. Children respond.
"Here is an image of a desert garden. What do you notice?"	
"The desert climate - weather - is dry - it doesn't rain often. The cactus plants are not shaded from the hot sun. There is no scarecrow to scare away animals."	
"Cactus needles protect the plant from animals and humans. Its roots are spread out to absorb as much water as possible when it does rain in the desert. Its waxy skin keeps the plant moist."	Point to 'needles.' Model 'spread out roots,' 'waxy skin.'
"How is the desert garden similar to or different from Zinnia and the girl and her mother's garden ?"	Children respond.
"All of the plants needed water and protection . The flowers and vegetables were watered and protected by gardeners ; the cacti were not."
