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Interesting Sounding Words: (Related to Zinnia's Flower Garden and The Ugly Vegetables)

Invite your child to play a word game with words they read in school. Say a word in a broken-up, slowed-down way, and then ask her/him to say the word again by blending the sounds together. For example, s/ee/d - seed, st/em/ stem, veg/et/ab/le - vegetable, g/ar/den - garden, w/orms- worms, b/ud - bud, spr/out - sprout.

Storytelling/Story Acting:

Tell your child a story about something growing, such as a garden, a plant, or a child. Act out the story with your child.
