 Make Way for Ducklings images of wheelbarrows/ tractors/ wheelchairs (see Resource) 	balance: having the same weight on both sides bumpy: not smooth; rough groove: a notch made in a surface roll: to turn over and over smooth: not bumpy; an even surface	tire: a ring of rubber that covers a wheel tread: the grooved pattern on a tire wheel: a circle-shaped part that helps cars move wheelchair: a chair with wheels for those who cannot walk	MAKE WAY FOR DUCKLINGS Robert McCloskey

Let's Find Out About It:			
Preparation: Set up materials.			
"In Make Way for Ducklings, Mr. and Mrs. Mallard looked for a safe place to live. What do you notice?"	Show illustrations. Children respond.		
"They were almost run over by a 'horrid thing rushing by'. Mr. Mallard jumped back from the bicycle wheels ."	Show illustrations.		
"Here are images and illustrations of other wheels . What do you notice?"	Show images and illustrations. Children respond.		
"The wheelbarrow balances on one wheel . Bicycle riders balance on two wheels ."			
"Here are images of tires that cover wheels . What do you notice?"	Show images. Children respond.		
"The large, smooth tires on the wheelchair help it roll down the ramp. The grooved treads on the tractor tires help it roll over bumpy roads."	Trace over tires.
