Ten Desired Elements for Improving Results

- 1. Building Capacity of State Staff
- 2. Transparency
- 3. Qualitative Data Collection
- 4. Active Engagement
- 5. Root Cause Analysis



General Supervision and RDA

Ten Desired Elements (cont.)

- 6. Cross-Division Work
- 7. Front Loading TA
- 8. Selection for Differentiated Intervention
- 9. Improvement Planning
- 10.Incentives (Rewards, Sanctions toward Accountability)



General Supervision is not...

- A "gotcha"
- Punitive in nature
- Optional





Differentiated Monitoring and Support

- The selection process for Tier 2 and 3 support will be objectively based on a point system for fiscal and programmatic areas.
- Districts with higher point totals will be provided with more support.
- The highest level of support may include, but is not limited to, monthly conference calls, ongoing TA, onsite visits and potential fiscal sanctions.



Differentiated Monitoring and Support

Fiscal Example:

- Did the district miss the MOE deadline?
- Is the district under special financial status, such as a conservatorship?
- Has the district had funds lapse?



Differentiated Monitoring and Support

Programmatic Example:

- Has the district missed timelines in clearing compliance monitoring or formal State complaint findings?
- Has the district used all the allotted teacher units?
