

District Graduation and Dropout Rates for the 2020 Accountability System

Background

In accordance with 34 C.F.R. 200.19(b) and Miss. Code Ann. §37-17-6, graduation and dropout rates were calculated following the four-year adjusted cohort method. This method determines the high school completion status for students four (4) years after entering Grade 9 for the first time during the school year (SY) 2015 - 2016 (Seniors SY 2018 - 2019) and graduated within the cohort window which ended July 31, 2019. The graduation rates for this cohort will be used in the 2020 Accountability Results.




State Level Graduation and Dropout Rates by Subgroup






