



Title I, Part D Allowable Uses

Use of this Document

This document is designed to support LEAs in identifying potential allowable uses of Title I Part D subgrant funds. It is important to note that while this document lists strategies and activities commonly funded, this should not be considered an exhaustive list, nor does it guarantee that an activity listed will be considered allowable for each sub-grantee; allowability is also based on a data-driven assessment of local needs.

Purpose of Title I Part D (Delinquent)

The purpose of Title I Part D, Subpart 1 program provides formula grants to SEAs for supplementary education services to help provide education continuity for children and youths in state-run institutions for juveniles and in adult correctional institutions so that these youths can make successful transitions to school or employment once they are released.

The Subpart 2 funds are awarded to LEAs with high proportions of youths in local correctional facilities to support dropout prevention programs for at-risk youths.

General Considerations

Programs and activities supported by Title I Part D funds must:

- Be consistent with the purpose of the Title I Part D funding;
- Be necessary, addressing identified needs;
- Be reasonable, considering breadth of impact and associated costs;
- Be used for evidence-based activities;
- Be utilized to supplement local and state funds, not supplant them; and
- Be coordinated with other available funds and resources to maximize the effectiveness and efficiency of spending
