







Parental Involvement • Regional Parental Involvement/PAC Meeting: • 6/6/2019 at Meridian-Lauderdale County Public Library in Meridian, MS; • 3 migrant families from Meridian and Quitman were to attend, but two were eventually unable to participate due to work-related and personal last-minute changes; the meeting was attended by a migrant mother and three migrant students and their older sibling; • Family learned about the internet safety and services provided by the library; students were signed up for the library's summer reading program;	Frepare
Students engaged in an activity practicing reading and comprehension, and the ability to find needed information in the text and use it (exit game); Family completed a survey on needs and topics of interest: Received a phone call from MMESC-hired teacher attempting to set up a home visit; mother was going to call her back, as some of the students have summer jobs, and she needed to make sure they all would be available; Students would like to attend a summer program; there is a local summer program that in past was financed by part from 21st Century Programs, but this year they did not get the funding, and family were told by the MMESC that MMESC cannot pay for it in such case; Students would love for the MMESC to be able to organize field trip(s) if a center-based summer program is not an option; Family would like to learn more about the internet safety; Individual parental involvement home visits and phone calls: Statewide; MiraCORE 2019 pilot test; Informing families about educational services available in	Parental
