Google Slides is an online presentation app that lets you create and format presentations individually or collaboratively. Slides allows users to create content by drawing, pasting images, linking videos and websites, and inserting text, shapes, tables, and other content onto a page in Google Drive. Users can create flow charts, diagrams, concept maps, visual storyboards, original art and more inside a presentation.

CLASSROOM CONNECTIONS

[4Cs: Collaboration, Communication, Creativity, Critical Thinking]

Users can collaboratively work on the same slide. This means students can collaborate from different computers at different locations. Slides can be shared via a link or embedded into a webpage.

Collaboration Students can work on a shared document adding and editing content and easily viewing changes to the slide in real time.

Communication Students can leave notes and comments on the slide to update other users.

Creativity Slides allows students to be expressive with ideas by creating original slides or compilations.

Critical Thinking Slides allows students to develop these skills by communicating their thoughts and learning reflections visually and verbally while receiving real-time feedback.

TRY IT

You can try out Google Slides as a beginning-of-the-year lesson or as an ice breaker. Create a “Getting to Know You” slide for classes. Have the students follow along creating their own personal slide on the slide deck. This is a great way to introduce yourself and Google slides to the students.
