
The ancient Babylonians were perhaps the first people to make New Year's resolutions, some 4,000 years ago. They were also the first known people to hold celebrations in honor of the new year. For them, however, the year began not in January but in mid-March, when the crops were plainted.

During a massive 12-day religious festival known as Akitu, the Babylonians made promises to the gods to pay their debts and return any objects they had borrowed. These promises could be considered the precursor to our New Year's resolutions. If they kept to their word, the Babylonians believed, their gods would be generous to them during the coming year. If they didn't, the gods would punish them.

Conducting a Google Search

The ability to effectively use online search as a research tool, including:

- -Picking the right search terms.
- -Evaluating results based on cues such as web address.
- -Tracking information to a reasonable source.
- -Assessing tone, style, audience, bias, and purpose to determine the credibility of information.
