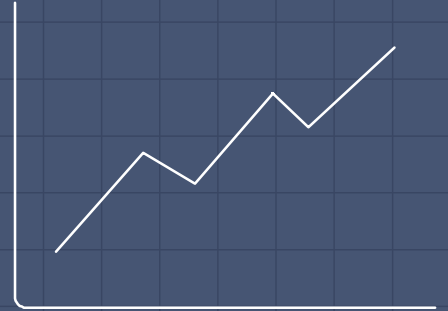
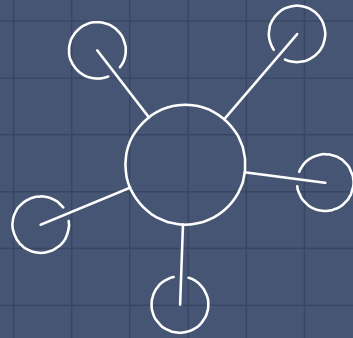
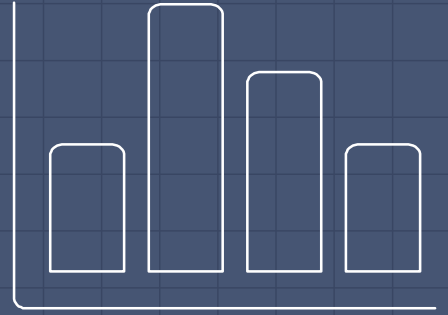
ABOUT MISSISSIPPI'S SLDS



- ❑ Is a data system that provides linkages between early childhood, K-12, postsecondary education, and the workforce
- ❑ Successfully moved the state beyond patchwork data-sharing across state agencies
- ❑ Includes more than 15 years of data from all state agencies involved in education, workforce, and public assistance
- ❑ Securely and efficiently facilitates research and analysis
- ❑ Supported by a state appropriation

- ❑ Statutory authority: Mississippi Code Annotated § 37-154-1 and 37-154-3
- ❑ Rules and regulations: Govern the use of data and process of conducting research and analysis
- ❑ Oversight: An 11-member governing board comprised of agency leaders
- ❑ State Data Clearinghouse: Mississippi State University's NSPARC
- ❑ Research review committee: Comprised of faculty from Mississippi's four major research universities, MDE, and MCCB
