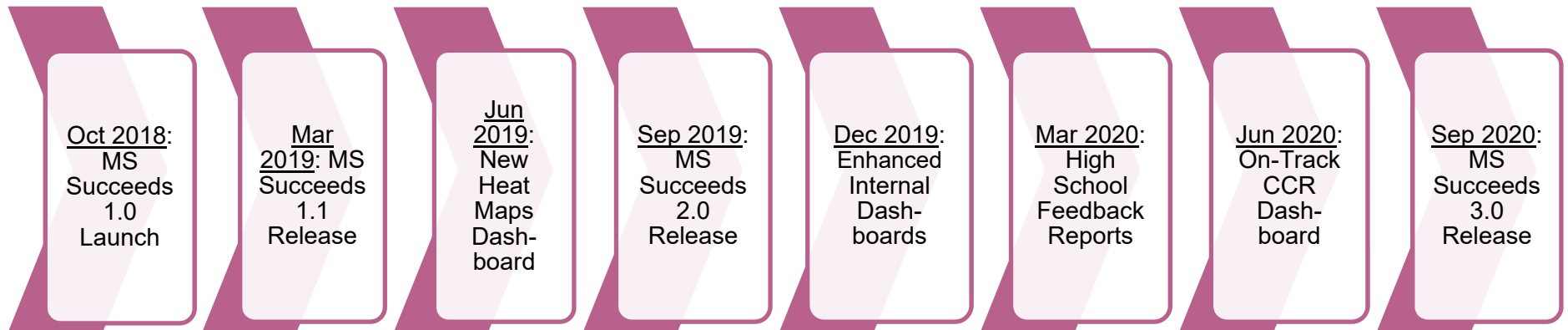

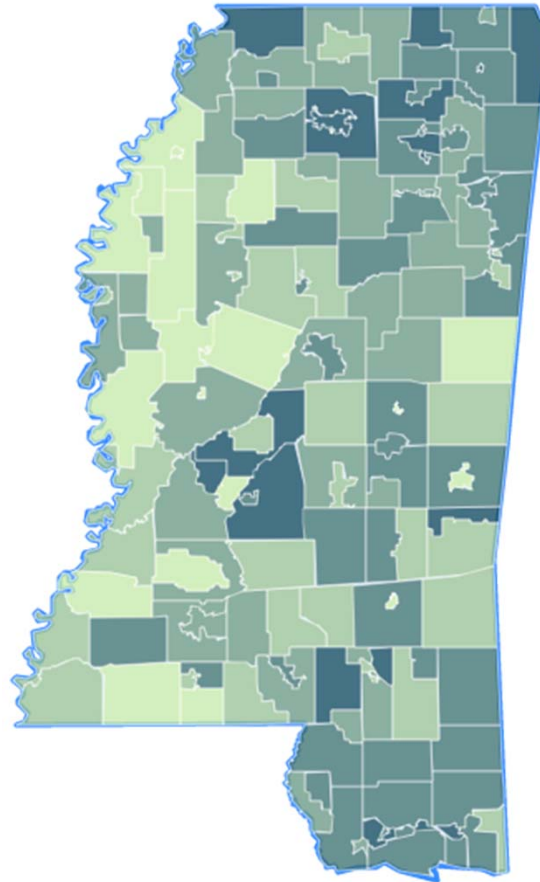
Dashboard Roadmap: Quarterly Output 2018 thru 2020

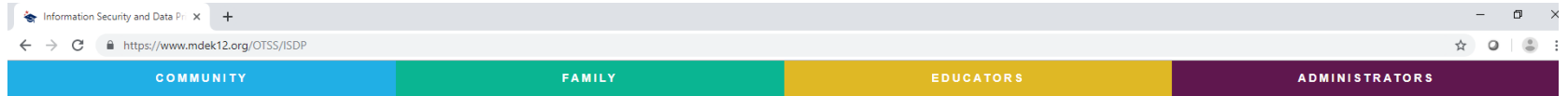

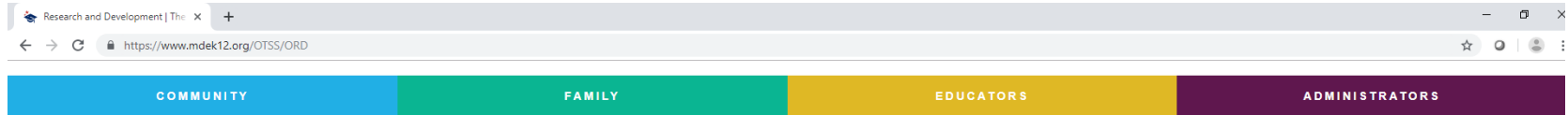

MSIS Modernization

GOALS

MSIS Modernization Goal 1

Re-engineer MDE's data submission process

- **Automated data collection in “near” real-time** (at least nightly), replacing the monthly and annual file submissions. This will result in more timely and actionable data, with more value for schools, teachers, students and families.
- **Automated and expanded data validation** to ensure that the data MDE collects mirrors the data schools and districts are using to make day-to-day decisions. This will result in more accurate data with less human effort.

MSIS Modernization Goal 2

Re-engineer MDE's data management processes

- **Automated data reporting** to increase the timeliness and reliability to data, including consistency across reports. This will support expanded reporting, while also freeing local (and MDE) staff to spend more time analyzing and using data to improve student outcomes.
- **Increased transparency** will empower districts by giving them the ability to see how their data informs reporting, accountability and funding at the MDE, and to certify that their data are correct. This will increase trust and reliability of data.

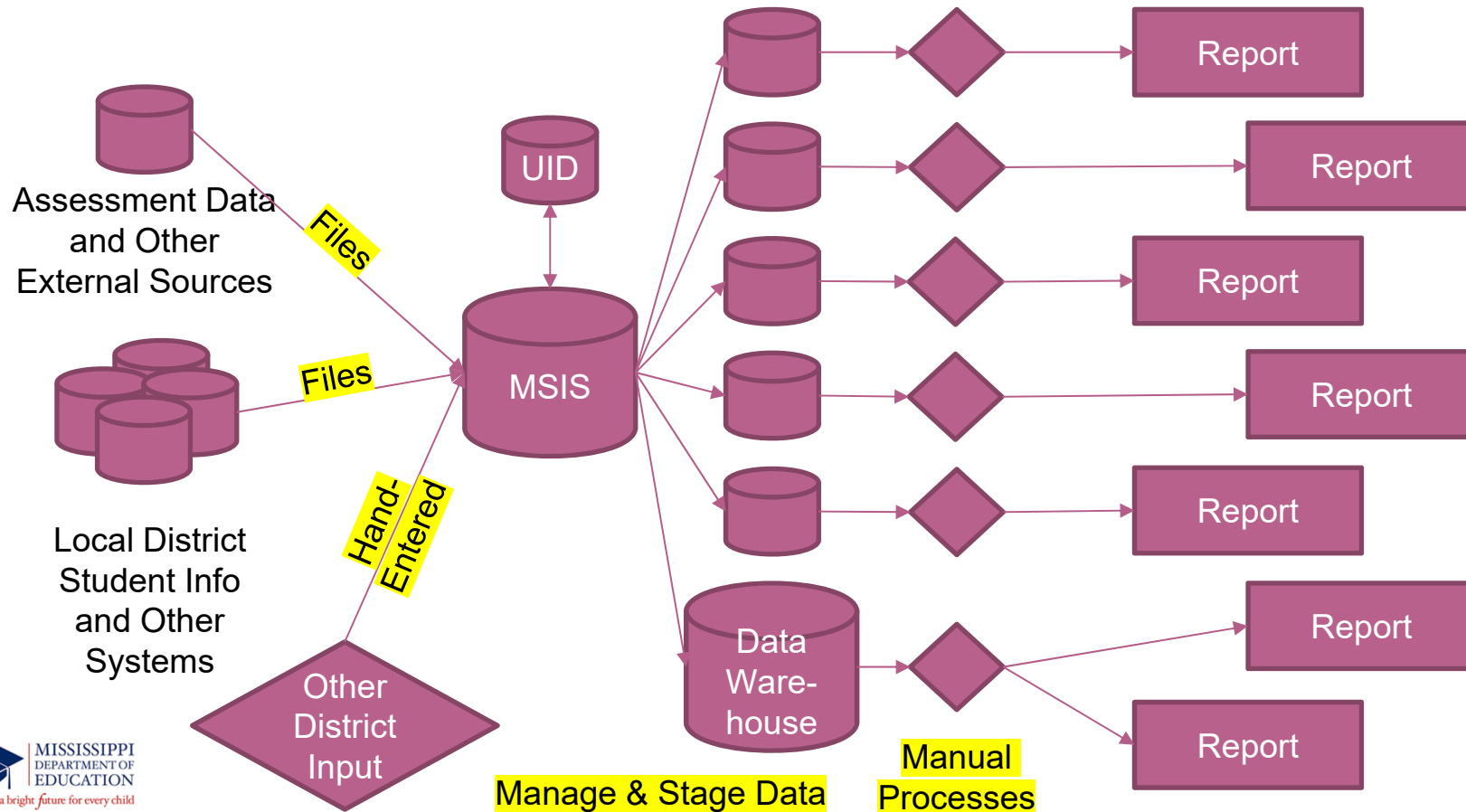
MSIS Modernization Value Propositions

- **For administrative staff**, MSIS modernization will improve data quality with less effort. This will free district resources so they can better support data quality and data-driven decision making.
- **For educators and students**, MSIS modernization will enable the return of near real-time, high-quality information to the classroom, strengthened by analysis of statewide, longitudinal data.
- **For state-level policy-makers**, MSIS modernization will support a more nimble and cost-effective way to provide accurate information needed to answer critical questions across a broad set of issues.

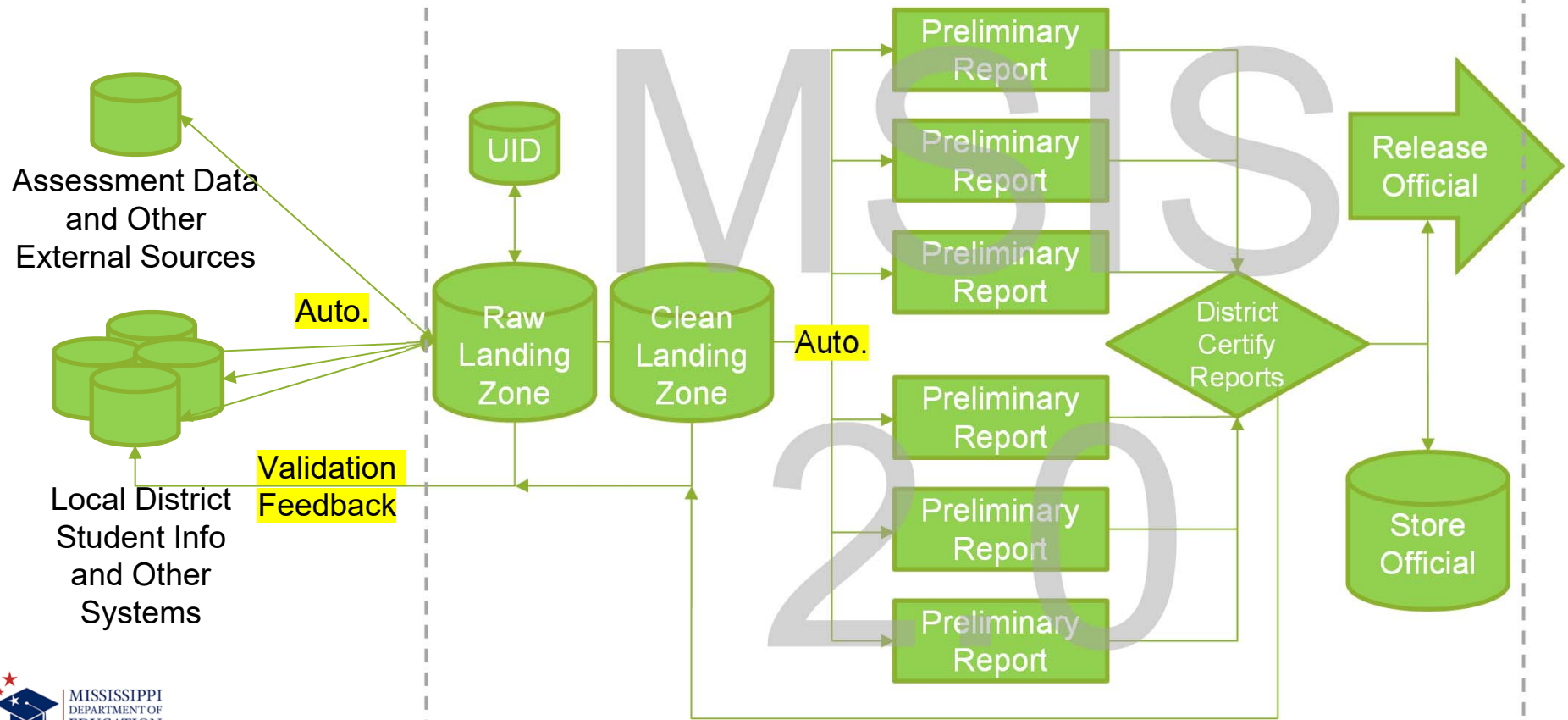

Phases & Deliverables

MSIS Modernization: Phase 1 (FY2020-21)

- **Work/Deliverables**
 - Document current systems and processes
 - Broad stakeholder engagement/input
 - Design/plans to re-engineer MSIS
 - Pilot components of the MSIS 2.0
 - Continue to develop/expand MS Succeeds Report Card, etc.

MSIS Modernization: Phase 2 (FY 2022-23)

- **Work/Deliverables**
 - MSIS 2.0 “near” real-time data/submission process
 - MSIS 2.0 “near” real-time data validation system
 - MSIS 2.0 data certification system/process
 - MSIS 2.0 transparent and automated data management system/process that supports and feeds data to the expanded MS Succeeds Report Card, etc.
