





### 72-hour Reporting



Incident involving specific infractions must be reported within 72 hours.









## MS Code Ann. 37-15-6 (amended in 2013) references a central reporting system for expulsions.

The 72-hour reporting is believed to have been set as a reasonable time frame for reporting the expulsion of a student. If an expelled student from one district tries to transfer to another district, the receiving district could look in the "central reporting system" to know to contact the "exporting" district to see what the reason for the expulsion was related to the safety of the receiving school.

### Disciplinary Action Taken

Depending on expulsion placement, this may also include:


Change of placement (long-term), placement in which the student is placed in the location for greater than 90 days

Change of placement (reassignment), temporary placement in which upon entry there is an expectation the student be placed there less than 90 days



**Incident:** A student was not following directions from the bus driver while the bus was in motion. Because it was a repeat offense, the student was assigned in-school suspension.








Districts will need a "Violation of School Rules" incident code marked as state-reported to be used in combination with state-reportable disciplinary action codes.

Districts will need an "Other" disciplinary action code marked as state-reported to be used in combination with state-reportable incident codes.








