14. Approval to award competitive grants for the 21ST Century Community Learning Centers Program

Purpose: To create *community learning centers* that provide academic enrichment opportunities for children, particularly students who attend high-poverty and low-performing schools, to meet State and local student standards in core academic subjects, to offer students a broad array of enrichment activities that can complement their regular academic programs, and to offer literacy and other educational services to the families of participating children.

Grants are awarded for a period of up to five (5) years to any public or private organization, including local educational agencies, non-profit agencies, city or county government agencies, faith-based organizations, institutions of higher education, and for-profit corporations, or consortia of two or more of such agencies, organizations, or entities.

Scope of Grant:

- Grant Period: August 1, 2012 – July 31, 2017
- Award Amount:
 - \$1,245,258.00 (Years 1 & 2)
 - \$ 996,206.40 (Year 3)
 - \$ 747,154.80 (Year 4)
 - \$ 498,103.20 (Year 5)
- Method of Award: Request for Proposals

Funding Source: Federal (Title IV, Part B, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the *No Child Left Behind Act of 2001*).
