OFFICE OF EDUCATOR LICENSURE

16. Approval to begin the Administrative Procedures Act Process: To Approve Request from Career and Technical Education for New License Codes as recommended by the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure Development

Background Information:

The Office of Career and Technical Education is seeking approval of three new vocational 900 level endorsement codes. Since the inception of the vocational high school redesign program, all vocational license endorsement codes have been 900 level licenses.

New License Recommendations:

On November 2, 2012, the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure Development approved three new vocational endorsement codes. The new codes are as the following:

912 Career Pathway: Law and Public Safety

913 Career Pathway: Energy Technology

965 Career Pathway: Transportation Logistics

912 Career Pathway: Law and Public Safety

This endorsement licenses a person to teach the following secondary courses:

990101	Law and Public Safety I
990102	Law and Public Safety II
990103	History of Law and Legal Systems
990104	Emergency Services and Corrections
990105	Topics in Law and Public Safety
990106	Emergency Management and Military Professions

Minimum Requirements for this Endorsement:

1. Education

Applicant must have earned a two-year college degree (associate degree) or higher from an accredited institution of higher education. The degree must be in Criminal Justice, Emergency Medicine, or an appropriate, related field approved by the MDE program coordinator.

2. Technology Literacy and Related Assessment of that Competency

Applicant must validate technology competency by attaining the established minimum score or higher on an assessment approved by the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE). The assessment must be directly related to technology competency required by the grade level and subject matter being taught. Approved assessments for this license are IC3, Propulse, or other specific assessment created by third-party vendors, authorized by the Local Education Agency (LEA) and approved by the MDE.

3. Occupational Experience and Related Assessment of that Experience

Applicants with an associate degree must have at least three years of verifiable occupational experience in the past ten years. The experience must be appropriate to the subject to be taught.

Applicants with a bachelor or higher degree must have at least one year of verifiable occupational experience in the past ten years. The experience must be appropriate to the subject to be taught.

Applicant must possess and maintain a Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT) Trainer Certification.

Applicant must possess and maintain National Incident Management System certifications:

100.b – Introduction to Incident Command System
100.LEb – Introduction to the Incident Command System of Law Enforcement
200.bICS – for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents
700.a – An Introduction to National Response Framework
800.b – An Introduction to National Response Framework

4. Teacher Education Preparation and Related Assessment(s) of that Education

Applicant must enroll immediately in Vocational Instructor Preparation (VIP) program.

Applicant must complete the individualized professional development plan (PDP) requirements of the VIP program prior to the expiration date of the three-year vocational license.

Applicant must successfully complete a Certification for online learning workshop, module, or course that is approved by the MDE Education.

Applicant must successfully complete the Law and Public Safety Certification workshop, module, or course that is approved by the MDE.

Note #1: If the applicant meets all requirements listed above, that applicant will be issued a 912 endorsement (five-year license). If the applicant does not meet all requirements, the applicant may be issued a three-year endorsement (license), and all requirements stated above must be satisfied prior to the ending date of that license.

This endorsement licenses a person to teach the following secondary courses:

Minimum Requirements for this Endorsement:

1. Education

Applicant must have earned a two-year college degree (associate degree) or higher from an accredited institution of higher education. The degree must be in an appropriate, related field approved by the MDE program coordinator.

2. Technology Literacy and Related Assessment of that Competency

Applicant must validate technology competency by attaining the established minimum score or higher on an assessment approved by the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE). The assessment must be directly related to technology competency required by the grade level and subject matter being taught. Approved assessments for this license are IC3, Propulse, or other specific assessment created by third-party vendors, authorized by the Local Education Agency (LEA) and approved by the MDE.

3. Occupational Experience and Related Assessment of that Experience

Applicants with an associate degree must have at least two years of verifiable occupational experience in the past ten years. The experience must be appropriate to the subject to be taught.

Applicants with a bachelor or higher degree must have at least one year of verifiable occupational experience in the past ten years. The experience must be appropriate to the subject to be taught.

Applicant must possess and maintain Energy Industry Fundamentals Certificate (comprehensive assessment) through the Center for Energy and Workforce Development or other teacher occupational competency assessment approved by the MDE Office of Career and Technical Education.

4. Teacher Education Preparation and Related Assessment(s) of that Education

Applicant must enroll immediately in Vocational Instructor Preparation (VIP) program.

Applicant must complete the individualized professional development plan (PDP) requirements of the VIP program prior to the expiration date of the three-year CTE license.

Applicant must successfully complete the Contren Instructor Certification.

Applicant must successfully complete a Certification for online learning workshop, module, or course that is approved by the MDE.

Applicant must successfully complete the Energy Technology Certification workshop, module, or course that is approved by the MDE.

Note #1: If the applicant meets all requirements listed above, the applicant will be issued a 913 endorsement (five-year license). If the applicant does not meet all requirements, the applicant may be issued a three-year endorsement (license), and all requirements stated above must be satisfied prior to the ending date of that license.

965 Career Pathway: Transportation Logistics

Minimum Requirements for this Endorsement:

1. Education

Applicant must have earned a two-year college degree (associate degree) or higher from an accredited institution of higher education. The degree must be in an appropriate, related field approved by the MDE program coordinator.

2. Technology Literacy and Related Assessment of that Competency

Applicant must validate technology competency by attaining the established minimum score or higher on an assessment approved by the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE). The assessment must be directly related to technology competency required by the grade level and subject matter being taught. Approved assessments for this license are IC3, Propulse, or other specific assessment created by third-party vendors, authorized by the Local Education Agency (LEA) and approved by the MDE.

3. Occupational Experience and Related Assessment of that Experience

Applicant must validate three years of full-time, professional supply management experience (non-clerical, non-support) in the past ten years.

Applicant must possess and maintain a valid Global Logistics Associate (GLA) certificate

4. Teacher Education Preparation and Related Assessment(s) of that Education

Applicant must enroll immediately in Vocational Instructor Preparation (VIP) program or the College and Career Readiness Educator Program (CCREP).

Applicant must complete the individualized professional development plan (PDP) requirements of the VIP or CCREP program prior to the expiration date of the three-year CTE license.

Applicant must successfully complete a Certification for online learning workshop, module, or course that is approved by the MDE.

Applicant must successfully complete the Transportation Logistics Certification workshop, module, or course that is approved by the MDE.

Note #1: If the applicant meets all requirements listed above, the applicant will be issued a 965 endorsement (five-year license). If the applicant does not meet all requirements, the applicant may be issued a three-year endorsement (license), and all requirements stated above must be satisfied prior to the ending date of that license.
