10. Approval to pilot Dashboards to Diplomas: Using Data for Student Success

Executive Summary

This new initiative will help districts to identify and support students in middle and high school who are at risk of disengaging from school. School districts will be able to identify students that have attendance, behavior, course performance and mobility problems that impede a student's ability to matriculate through the K-12 environment. Educators will have student-based indicators derived from the key factors proven by research necessary for school success.

We are excited to announce the Dashboards to Diplomas: Using Data for Student Success pilot project. Sponsored by the Mississippi Department of Education, this new initiative will help districts to identify and support students in middle and high school who are at risk of disengaging from school. The Department has developed Early Warning Dashboards that will provide educators with student-based indicators derived from the key factors proven by research to be necessary for school success. 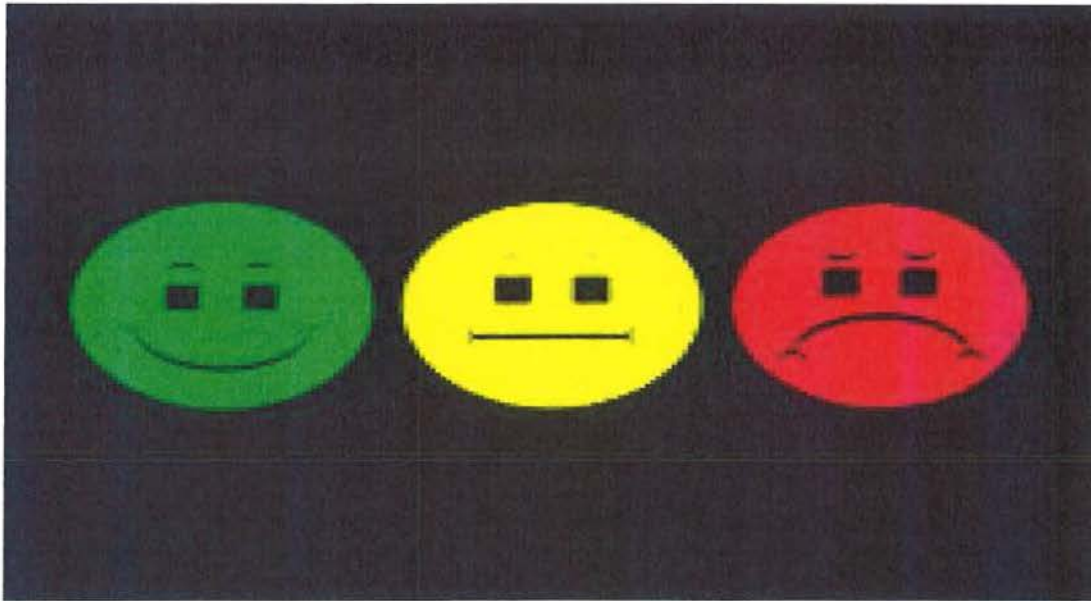
- Why are you interested in participating in this project?
- Who will be assigned as the primary person leading this project for your district? Primary contact? Secondary contact?
- What kinds of interventions are in place in your district concerning identifying and supporting students that are at risk of disengaging from schools?
- What data do you currently submit to MSIS?
- How often do you submit course grades to MDE (6 weeks, 9 weeks, etc.)?
- What type of student support system is in place in your district? Please list personnel positions that are involved that support this system.
- Please include school board and superintendent assurances and written support for participation in all mandated data collection, training sessions, weekly stakeholder meetings, and other relevant project activities.

As you know, raising student achievement is a critical mission for our schools and educators, and we are dedicated to supporting you as you work toward this goal for all of Mississippi's children. Selected participants should be notified by September 4, 2013.

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The Early Warning System (EWS) will provide school districts a tool to monitor and intervene with students who are identified as “at risk” of dropping out of school based on attendance, behavior, course performance and mobility.

The attached memorandum was disseminated to every school district in Mississippi. The Mississippi Department of Education received a letter of interest from eight (8) school districts: Booneville School District, Holly Springs School District, Indianola School District, Jackson Public School District, Jefferson County School District, Jefferson Davis County Schools, Louisville Municipal School District and Yazoo City Municipal School District. All of the districts were chosen with the exception of Yazoo City Municipal School District.
