16. <u>Discussion to revise Accreditation Policy 2.3, Annual Accreditation Statuses, to read under the definition of Withdrawn that any school district placed in conservatorship may have its accreditation withdrawn (Has cleared the Administrative Procedures Act process with one public comment)</u>

Policy 2.3, Annual Accreditation Statuses, is being revised to allow the Commission on School Accreditation and State Board of Education greater flexibility regarding the Withdrawal of Accreditation in a district that is placed in Conservatorship.

The temporary and final action is necessary to implement the policy revisions for the 2013-2014 school year immediately upon its filing with the Secretary of State in accordance with Section 25-43-3.113(2)(b)(ii) of the *Mississippi Code of 1972*, as amended. For a rule to become effective immediately upon its filing, the Board is required to make a finding that the rule only confers a benefit or removes a restriction on the public or some segment thereof.
