## OFFICE OF EDUCATOR LICENSURE

E. Revise the Licensure Guidelines K-12 requirements for the One Year Teacher
Intern License as recommended by the Commission on Teacher and
Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and Development
(Has cleared the Administrative Procedures Act process without public comment)

<u>Background Information</u>: On September 9, 2016, the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and Development approved the proposed revision to the *Licensure Guidelines K-12* requirements for the One Year Teacher Intern License.

The non-renewable teacher intern license (101) is issued to a student of a nationally accredited teacher preparation program that is not currently employed in a teaching position. This license is specific to those working to complete a teacher preparation degree program.

The proposed revision will require an intern license to be issued to a student earning a degree in a teacher preparation outside the state of Mississippi. Based on the current guidelines, only students earning a degree from a teacher preparation program in Mississippi are required to obtain the 101 Intern License.

## ONE YEAR TEACHER INTERN LICENSE

The non-renewable teacher intern license (101) is issued to a student of a nationally accredited teacher preparation program and is NOT currently employed in a teaching position. This license is specific to those working to complete a teacher preparation degree program.
