H. <u>Approval of educator preparation programs as recommended by the Commission</u> on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and <u>Development</u>

<u>Background Information</u>: In accordance with Miss. Code Ann. § 37-3-2(1) there is established within the MDE the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and Development (Licensure Commission). It shall be the purpose and duty of the Commission to make recommendations to the Mississippi Board of Education regarding standards for the certification and licensure and continuing professional development of those who teach or perform tasks of an educational nature in the public schools of Mississippi. Full documents pertaining to each program review are available upon request.

The Division of Educator Preparation is requesting full state approval for Delta State University based on the MDE's Program Reviews, the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) National Accreditation Decision, and as recommended by the Licensure Commission on November 4, 2022.

The Division of Educator Preparation is requesting full state approval for Mississippi State University's Research and Curriculum Unit (RCU) to offer an approved educator preparation program that that would lead to a supplemental endorsement in the area of Teacher Leadership (educator licensure endorsement code 481) as recommended by the Licensure Commission on November 4, 2022. The program will be rendered effective 30 days following the receipt of final approval by the Mississippi State Board of Education.

3.1 MDE Program Review Recommendation

Date: April 9, 2021

Comments: Delta State University submitted their electronic program review as part of the cohort for Pilot 2.0. Feedback was sent to the EPP on September 25, 2020, for revisions, and rejoinders were submitted January 26, 2021. Findings from the first review noted syllabi containing old standards, secondary programs lacking a standalone Data Analysis and Evaluation course, incomplete information on how candidates are introduced, reinforced, and master data-driven instruction, and incomplete information on types of technology used to inform instruction and practice. Targeted date for implementation of new courses was spring 2022.

EPP has elected to close the Special Education-Mild/Moderate Disabilities (M) program effective December 31, 2022, due to low enrollment.

Mississippi State University's Research and Curriculum Unit (RCU)

Approval of proposed educator preparation program by Mississippi State University's Research and Curriculum Unit (RCU) that would lead to a supplemental endorsement in the area of Teacher Leadership. The program includes a year-long, 100-clock hours licensure pathway that would lead to a supplemental endorsement in the area of Teacher Leadership (educator licensure endorsement code 481). This proposed supplemental endorsement licensure pathway includes eight (8) onsite and four (4) virtual professional learning sessions comprised of Defining & Understanding the Five Roles of Instructional Coaching: Coach U.I Onboarding; Coach U.II Partnering with School Leadership; Coach U.III Coaching Successes and Dilemmas; and Coach U.IV Overall Evaluation, Reflective Essay, Presentation, & Graduation.

In addition to successful completion of the criteria outlined above, in order to be deemed eligible for licensure, the applicant shall hold a valid Class AA license or above and verify a minimum of three (3) years teaching experience as the teacher of record. Applicants shall meet all requirements in effect on the date the complete application for licensure and supporting documents are received in the MDE Division of Educator Licensure. This supplemental endorsement shall be effective 30 days following the receipt of final approval by the Mississippi State Board of Education.
