04.A. <u>Action: Modify competitive grants for the Nita M. Lowey 21st Century Community Learning Centers Program</u> [Goals 1 and 2 – MBE Strategic Plan]

<u>Background and Purpose</u>: Section 4204(j) of ESSA authorizes the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE) to renew grants awarded to eligible entities under ESSA, based on the eligible entity's performance during the preceding grant period, at the MDE's discretion. Under section 312 of the Department of Education Appropriations Act, 2016, the provisions of ESSA apply to 21st CCLC program grants awarded during the 2017-2018 school year and later years.

The Nita M. Lowey 21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) program is designed to provide opportunities for academic enrichment activities during non-school hours or periods when school is not in session, such as before and after school or during summer recess, particularly for students who attend low-performing schools. The 21st CCLC programs offer students a broad array of additional services, programs and activities that are designed to complement the regular academic program such as youth development activities, counseling programs, arts, music, physical fitness and wellness programs, financial literacy programs, environmental literacy programs, and career and technical programs. The 21st CCLC programs also offer families opportunities for active and meaningful engagement in their child's education, including opportunities for literacy and related educational development.

Grants were awarded for a period of up to three (3) years with an option to renew by meeting all renewability requirements. Renewed grants will be funded up to 60% of the original award.
