Lowey 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) Program is designed to provide opportunities for academic enrichment activities during non-school hours or periods when school is not in session, such as before and after school or during summer recess, particularly for students who attend low-performing schools. Lowey 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC programs offer students a broad array of additional services, programs and activities that are designed to complement the regular academic program such as youth development activities, counseling programs, arts, music, physical fitness and wellness programs, financial literacy programs, environmental literacy programs, and career and technical programs. - Year 2 – 100% funding from MDE
- Year 3 – ~~100%~~ 80% funding from MDE
- Year 4 – ~~100%~~ 60% funding from MDE
