2.B. Action: Award competitive grants for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Centers Program [Goals 1 and 2 – MBE Strategic Plan]

Purpose: To create *community learning centers* that provide academic enrichment opportunities for children, particularly students who attend high-poverty and low- performing schools, to meet State and local student standards.

Grants are awarded for a period of up to three (3) years to any public or private organization, including local educational agencies, non-profit agencies, city or county government agencies, community-based organizations, Indian tribes or tribal organizations, faith-based organizations, institutions of higher education, and for-profit corporations, or consortia of two or more of such agencies, organizations, or entities.

Scope of Grant:

- Grant Period: November 9, 2017 – September 30, 2020
- Award Amount: \$3,704,654.00 Year 1  
\$3,704,648.00 Year 2  
\$2,963,561.70 Year 3
- Method of Award: Request for Proposals

Funding Source: Title IV, Part B, of the *Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)*, as amended by the *Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015*

Continuation grants previously awarded will be funded a total amount of \$3,724,900.12 over the life of their grants through this appropriation.

Summary of Selection Process:

A competitive grant selection process was utilized to award the grants.

- B. Program Plan and Implementation
- C. Evaluation
- D. Budget
