Minutes of Mississippi Board of Education Meeting

June 17, 2021

The members of the Mississippi Board of Education met in a Board meeting at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 17, 2021, via teleconference and video means pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. § 25-41-5 for the purpose of conducting the Board meeting.

The meeting was available to the public via live stream.¹ Board members present at Central High School, 4th Floor Boardroom, Jackson, Mississippi were: Ms. Rosemary G. Aultman, Dr. Angela Bass, Mr. Glen V. East, Dr. Karen J. Elam, Mr. Matt Miller, Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee, and Dr. Wendi Barrett appeared via videoconference (Biloxi, Mississippi). Student Representative: Ms. Amy Zhang appeared via teleconference (Starkville, Mississippi). Dr. Carey M. Wright was present at Central High School, 4th Floor Boardroom, Jackson, Mississippi.

- I. Ms. Rosemary G. Aultman called the Board meeting to order at 10:05 a.m., after determining that a quorum of the Board existed at the locations stated for the purpose of conducting a meeting through teleconference and video means in accordance with Miss. Code Ann. § 25-41-5.
 - Ms. Aultman welcomed Mr. Bill Jacobs to his first Board meeting. Ms. Aultman also stated that Mr. Matt Miller and Dr. Wendi Barrett were also new Board members.
- II. Dr. Karen J. Elam led the Pledge of Allegiance and Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee gave the Invocation.
- III. On a motion by Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee, seconded by Dr. Karen J. Elam, the Board voted unanimously to approve the May 20, 2021, Board meeting minutes.
- IV. On a motion by Dr. Karen J. Elam, seconded by Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee, the Board voted unanimously to approve the agenda as presented.
- V. Dr. Carey M. Wright gave the following report as the State Superintendent of Education:
 - Dr. Wright welcomed the new Board members.
 - Dr. Wright stated that she serves on the Children's Health Council and they
 meet monthly to make sure we know what everyone is working on and that
 we can complement each other's work.

¹ Due to the impact of COVID-19 (coronavirus) and the recommendations of the CDC and the Mississippi Department of Health, gatherings should be restricted to no more than 10 people. To protect the public health, the State Board of Education met via teleconference and video means and the meeting was available to the public via video means (live stream). The SBE exercised their authority granted by the Governor in his Proclamation of a State of Emergency. See Miss. Code Ann. § 33-15-31.

- Dr. Wright stated that she and Ms. Aultman met with the Lt. Governor Hosemann to go over MDE plans for spending all our federal dollars that related to the ESSA and the COVID funds. Dr. Wright stated that the Lt. Governor informed them of how he was spending his funds and wanted to know how MDE was spending ours. Dr. Wright stated she informed him that the Department does not have the authority over how the districts spend their funds. Dr. Wright stated the districts do have to submit a plan to MDE and MDE will send them a template soon that drills down into more depth on how their funds are spent. Dr. Wright stated that the last round of funds must be obligated by May 2022 and they have until September 30, 2024 to spend the money.
- Dr. Wright stated the National Assessment Governing Board has been working on the new reading framework by which the National Assessment of Education Progress (NAPE) is administered. Dr. Wright stated there have been some concerns expressed about the document so the Chair of the National Assessment Governing Board, former Governor Haley Barbour, has assembled a subcommittee of the Board to address the concerns and she is on the subcommittee to review and give feedback to the Board. Dr. Wright stated they would vote on the new framework in August and the new framework will be used for the 2026 assessment.
- Dr. Wright stated that she was asked by the Tennessee Chamber of Commerce, the Tennessee State Chief, and the Arkansas State Chief to be on a webinar to talk about assessments, about how assessments are being used in the state, and summative assessment and data related to assessments. Dr. Wright stated this was a very informative webinar.
- Dr. Wright stated that she brought greetings virtually to the Mississippi PTA on their 102nd Convention.
- Dr. Wright stated that the Council for Grade Level Reading asked her to be on a panel with several other people to present the Big Bets that we feel that will change education in the future.
- Dr. Wright stated that she was on a panel about women in public service leading state agencies at the Mississippi University for Women (MUW) this week.
- VI. Ms. Rosemary G. Aultman, Chair of the State Board, gave the following report.
 - Ms. Aultman stated they met with the Lt. Governor Hosemann and had a
 good discussion about the money that districts are getting, the state is
 getting, and the ways to spend the funds. Ms. Aultman stated that he was
 very supportive of several things that Dr. Wright presented particularly our
 early learning collaboratives and finding more money for seats for children.
 Ms. Aultman stated that he was wanting some things that would be
 generational for children such as early childhood development.
 - Ms. Aultman stated that Dr. Angela Bass chaired the Ad-Hoc Committee along with Mr. Glen V. East on interviewing the applicants for student representative. Ms. Aultman stated that yesterday the Board interviewed

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the three finalists and selected Ms. Micah Hill from Laurel School District as the junior student representative. Ms. Aultman stated that the Board is looking forward to working with her.

VII. Report of Student Representative

Ms. Amy Zhang talked about how she and her peers are spending summer vacation. Ms. Zhang stated that they have been taking advantage of their free time by participating in a lot of summer activities and currently she has been working as a research assistant at Mississippi State University (MSU) under the Department of Biological Sciences and she has been interning as a Policy Analyst at the Institute for Youth and Policy where she writes articles on U.S. policies. Ms. Zhang stated that her first article will be published on the Institute's web site early next month. Ms. Zhang stated that she has friends that are doing research at the University of Mississippi (Ole Miss) through the program of Rebel Research A.R.I.S.E. Ms. Zhang stated they are doing more of their own projects with more of their own ideas for their research. Ms. Zhang stated that some are doing things to help people in their community. For example, about a dozen MSMS students volunteer as camp counselors at the MSMS summer enrichment program every week. Ms. Zhang stated that a group of students have set up an online tutoring program for elementary school students. Ms. Zhang stated that some people are organizing ACT and test prep meetings and one classmate has set up a meeting in early July to help people take a practice ACT test for the people who are taking the July ACT. Ms. Zhang stated that rising seniors are worring about college applications, essays, what to major in, what to do for the rest of their lives, and she admitted that she does not have all her answers right now, but she stated she has a few months to decide. Ms. Zhang stated that she would like to welcome Ms. Micah Hill to the Board of Education as the junior student representative. Ms. Zhang also congratulated Ms. Isabelle Reynolds as being selected as the alternative. Ms. Zhang stated that she is excited to see Ms. Hill form her ideas on statewide education into a reality and as well as hear what unique perspective she will bring to the table and she is looking forward to serving with her for the next year.
