At Risk After School Meals Program

- The At-Risk Afterschool Meals Program is a component of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) which offers federal funding to After School Programs that serve a meal and/or snack to children in low-income areas.

NSLP vs At-Risk Afterschool Meals Program

- Schools offer a snack under the NSLP, but the At Risk After School Meals Program allows schools to offer both a snack and/or supper.



Program Eligibility

- Be organized primarily to provide care for children after school
- Provide organized, regularly scheduled activities
- Be located in an eligible area
- Must occur after the regular school day

Process to Participate

- The School District (SD) submits a letter of request.
- The State Agency (SA) sends the SD a Permanent Agreement for participation.
- The SD returns Permanent Agreement to SA.
- The SA provides on-site training to SD.

Process to Participate

- The SD submits the application on-line.
- The SA reviews and approves application.
- The effective date of participation is the date in which the the SA receives a complete application.

Meal Pattern Requirements for Snack

- Fluid Milk 8 oz
- Meat/Meat Alternate 1 oz
- Fruits $\frac{3}{4}$ cup
- Vegetables $\frac{3}{4}$ cup
- Grain 1 serving/1 slice



Meal Pattern Requirements for Supper

- Fluid Milk 8 oz.
- Meat/Meat Alternate 2 oz.
- Vegetable ½ cup
- Fruit ¼ cup
- Grain 1 serving
