Dear Dr. Nash:

The State Agency (SA) completed an Administrative Review (AR) of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) during the week of March 23, 2022. An exit conference was conducted on March 31, 2022. The regulations governing the Administrative Review (7 CFR 210.18) require the SA to review two Critical Areas: Performance Standard 1 (Meal Access and Reimbursement) and Performance Standard 2 (Meal Pattern and Nutritional Quality). The Review additionally covers several General Areas of Review. Over the course of the SA Review, one (1) finding was identified relating to Performance Standard 1. The SA is pleased to report that this finding has not resulted in fiscal action. The finding which was identified is described below.

## Performance Standard 1: Meal Access and Reimbursement

• In accordance with 7 CFR 210.18 (g)(1)(ii), the school food authority shall establish internal controls which ensure the accuracy of meal counts prior to the submission of the monthly Claim for Reimbursement. The Reveiwer noted that the SFA is using a paper tracking system for meal counts. The Reviewer questions if this method is the most accurate given the manner in which counts are recorded as a total rather than utilizing a check or tally system. Based on the meal observation, the SA has no reason to refute the accuracy of the claim submitted and will therefor not seek fiscal action in this matter. However, in order to ensure the accuracy of future claims, the SFA must submit a plan to return to a more accurate method of meal counting and recording, this could include utilization of the electronic POS.

The School Food Authority (SFA) **must provide a corrective action response to all findings** of the Review by **May 9, 2022**. This response must be entered into the Mississippi Application and Reimbursement System (MARS) by an authorized signatory for the Child Nutrition Programs. If an authorized signatory is unable to access the Compliance module in MARS, the district must submit a corrective action plan on District letterhead that is signed by an authorized signatory.

In addition to conducting the AR, one of the functions of the SA is to provide Technical Assistance (TA). During the course of the review, the SA Reviewer provided TA in several areas to the CND.
