Dear Mr. Kent:

The State Agency (SA) completed an Administrative Review (AR) of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), School Breakfast Program (SBP), and Afterschool Snack Program (ASCP) during the week of March 6, 2023. An exit conference was conducted on March 23, 2023. The regulations governing the Administrative Review (7 CFR 210.18) require the SA to review two Critical Areas: Performance Standard 1 (Meal Access and Reimbursement) and Performance Standard 2 (Meal Pattern and Nutritional Quality). The Review additionally covers several General Areas of Review. Over the course of the SA Review, **one (1) finding was identified, unrelated to Performance Standards 1 and 2.** The SA is pleased to report that **none of the findings have resulted in fiscal action.** The findings which were identified are described below.

## LEA Level Finding General Area:

• In Accordance to 7 CFR 210.11(c)(1), all competitive food and beverages sold to students on the school campus during the school day must meet the Smart Snack standards. The LEA had 4 drink machines, 2 of the machine advertised "Coke", which is a non-compliant item. The LEA also had non-compliant items in the drink machines for both junior high and high school. The LEA was also missing the nutritional facts for all items in the drink machine. In order to implement corrective action, the LEA must have the non-compliant advertisement removed. The LEA must show proof that all non-compliant items in the machines were removed. Also, the LEA must submit a list of the nutritional fact for all items placed in the machine.

The LEA **must provide a corrective action response to all findings** of the Review by May 13, 2023. The district must submit a corrective action plan on District letterhead that is signed by an authorized signatory for the child nutrition program.

In addition to conducting the AR, one of the functions of the SA is to provide Technical Assistance (TA). During the course of the review, the SA Reviewer provided TA in several areas to the CND. TA is documented in MARS, specifically in the "Technical Assistance" section of the "Compliance" Module. TA is provided for the improvement of the program operations and is not considered a finding.

The SA would like to commend the SFA on a job well done! The Staff were very friendly and work very well together. They have an excellent rapport with the children and have appetizing food that encourages participation. I would like to commend the Director for the creative and innovative things that are happening with child nutrition in the district. Keep up the Great Work!!
